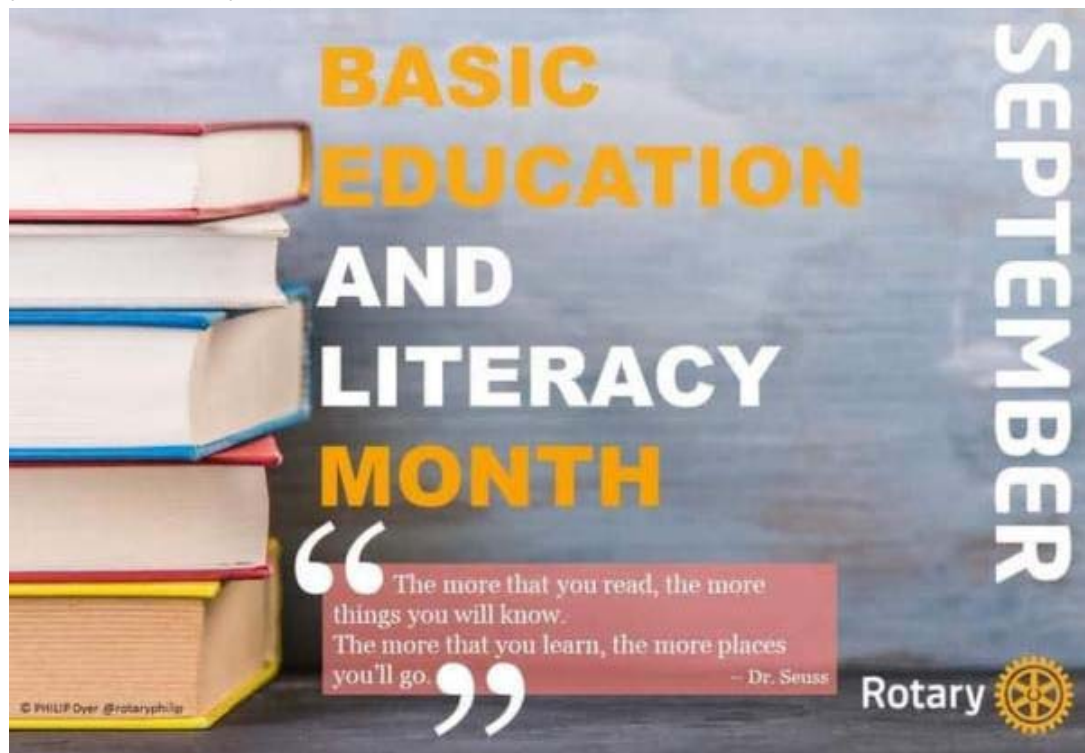

- Stacey Wixson updated us on Steak N ♦ Bake N ♦ Raffle (SBR), which is only 2 weeks away.

Program:

Kevin Horrigan hosted Ryan Vaughn as today's guest speaker. Ryan is the President of the Indiana Sports Corporation (ISC). Ryan is a graduate of Wabash College and earned his law degree from Indiana University School of Law in Indianapolis. He and his wife, Heather, reside in Indianapolis.

Before leading the Indiana Sports Corporation, Ryan served as the Chief of Staff for Indianapolis Mayor Greg Ballard. Here, he oversaw development and implementation of Indy's strategic planning initiatives, public policy development, financial security and managed the agency directors and deputy mayors. This should make several of you very happy ◊ Vaughn was a lawyer with Barnes & Thornburg, focusing on government relations and finance at the local, State & Federal levels. In addition, he served as a counselor on the Indianapolis-Marion County City-County Council from 2007-2012 and was Council President from 2009-2011.

Ryan has been a member of a many boards and committees, including Downtown Indy, the YMCA Athenaeum, the Indiana War Memorial Foundation, Super Bowl 46 Host Committee, Super Bowl 52 Bid Committee, the Indiana Host Committee for the 2015 NCAA Final Four and the Indiana Host Committee for the 2021 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament. Ryan was also a founding board member of Purchased, Inc. which is a non-profit organization aimed at spreading awareness of human trafficking and the prevention thereof.

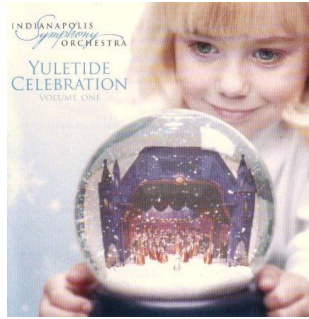
Indiana Sports Corporation was the founded in 1979. This not-for-profit organization is the first ever nation's sports commission. Many other states have since followed Indiana's model in creating their own sports commissions. The Indiana Sports Corporations mission is to create a positive impact by hosting world-class sporting events that enhance vibrancy in the community, build civic pride, drive economic impact, have a positive media exposure, and encourage opportunities for youth. Since its formation, other states have followed ISC's lead and as a result, ISC competes with other cities to attract sporting events to Indianapolis. ISC has been instrumental in turning the tide of urban flight in Indianapolis. ISC was responsible for bringing the Super Bowl to our City; the NCAA Headquarters; NCAA Basketball Championships and regional tournaments; the 1987 Pan Am games; Big Ten Football Championships and Big Ten Basketball Championships (alternating with Chicago, each year). ISC's has attracted as many as 40,000 volunteers (for the Pan Am Games) and as few as 40 for their events.
