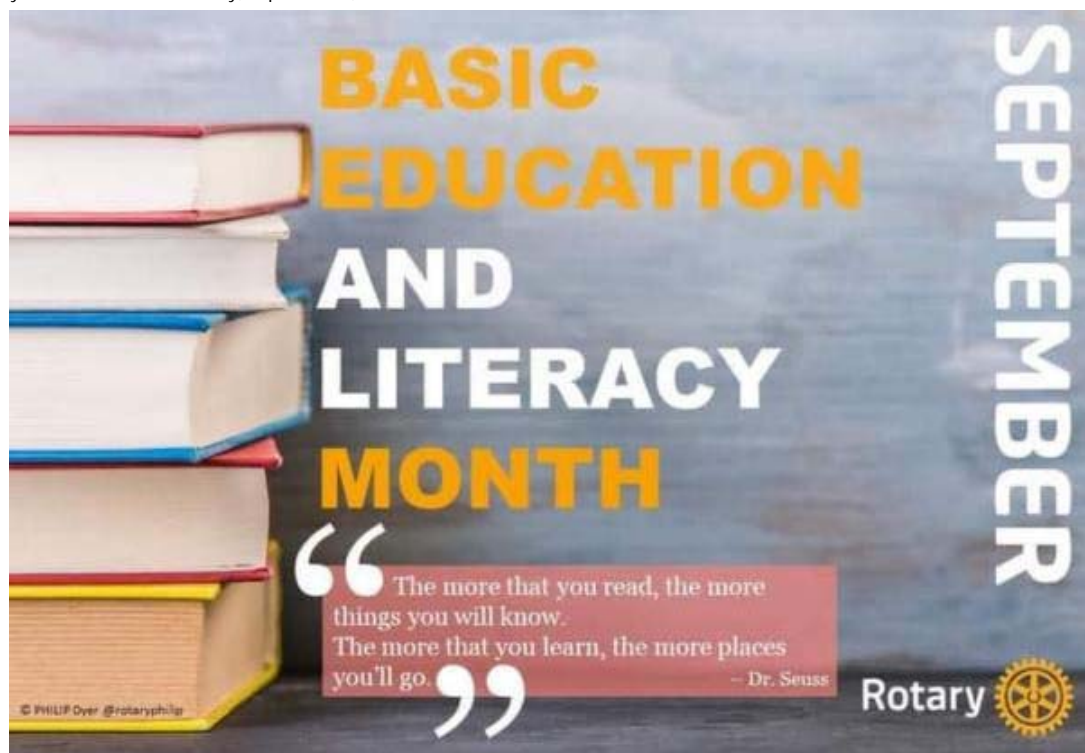

- Stacey Wixson updated us on Steak N Bake N Raffle (SBR), which is only 2 weeks away.
- Stacey's biggest concern is ticket sales, Debbie Low reports that not many Rotarians have turned in money or raffle stubs. To date Deb Low thinks, we have sold approximately 200 tickets. If we do the math, however, 85 active Rotarians selling 4 tickets each should result in 340 sold tickets and that does not even factor in those who sold more than 4 tickets. Rotarians have until Thursday, September 16th to return their completed ticket stubs with money. In the past we have allowed people to buy tickets at the door up until 7pm. Stacey will let us know if we plan to do the same this year.
- SBR TICKETS ARE NOW ON SALE. Deb Low handed out tickets to Rotarians to buy & sell. Tickets are \$40 each. Each Rotarian is asked to either buy or sell, at least 4 tickets. Rotarians need a ticket to get a steak dinner and complimentary drink, even if they have volunteered to work the event.

If you want to put a group together of 8 or more guests, you can request that a table be reserved for your group. This is recommended because people are always scrambling to get a seat. We really ask Rotarians to make sure that their 4 tickets are purchased and that the recipients attend the function. Having our guests participate in the games and side venues at the event help us give meaningful grants to the Top Five Peoples Choice organizations. We discourage returning tickets, especially if it is close to September 18th. This is one of our fun events, so please volunteer, enjoy, and bring family and friends. We won't over-work you. Remember, return the ticket stubs and money to Deb Low, as soon as possible. We want to get everyone's name printed on the raffle board.

- Rob mentioned that the Board has decided that this event will be held. We plan to take every reasonable precaution to avoid the spread of COVID:
 - Rotarians will be asked to wear masks, while working the event
 - Tables will be spread further apart to create an element of social distancing
 - There will be masks available for guests and we will encourage them to wear one, when not eating and drinking.
 - There will be sanitizer located throughout the facility.
 - Food will be in containers, where possible
- Setup for Steak N Bake N Raffle will be on Friday, September 17th at 5:30pm at the 4H Exhibit Hall. Please plan to help, since we need to reorganize our layout, due to Covid.
- Rob is targeting October 14th as the date we move our meetings to the Depot. Rob is planning to have an alternate meeting site for the October 7th meeting, since Riley Days will be in full swing, and our District Governor plans to visit us that day.
- The District Governor, Ray Kramp, will be visiting our October 7, 2021, meeting, during Riley Days festivities.
- Jim Greig announced that we will have approximately 30 people attending the Yuletide Celebration, on Saturday night at 8pm at the Hilbert Theatre.
- Greg Warner shared that there will be a Blood Drive on Saturday, September 18th from 10 am to 3pm at the library.
