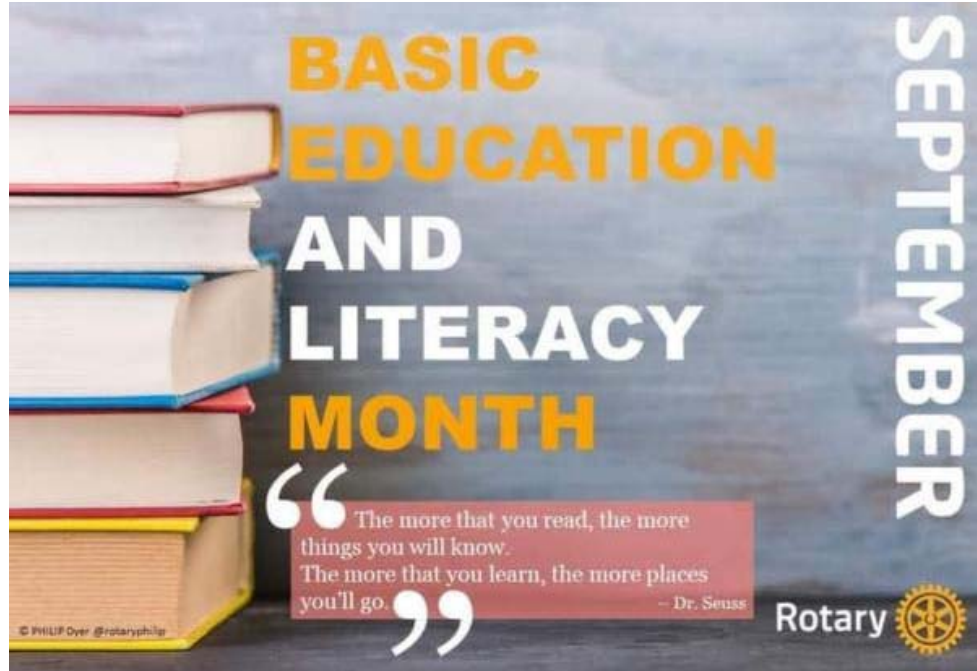

- Brian Lott has asked for volunteers to help with distributing flyers and yard signs throughout town for Fill a Truck-Fill a Pantry. This year ♦s event will be held FROM 10am to 3pm at the Greenfield Christian Church ♦s parking lot. The beneficiaries of this food drive will be the:

Brian pointed out that the Hancock County Food Pantry has volunteered to be a distribution center for other food pantries in the county needing help. Hancock County Food Pantry can turn a dollar donation into five dollars of food. They welcome such cash donations.

- Stacey Wixson informed the club that we raised \$36,490 from Steak N ♦ Bake N ♦ Raffle and that the non-profits in People ♦s Choice raised \$106,000. This is the most ever raised at this event and we had only 350 guests (70 less than average).

## Program 1:

Karen Willits arranged for the manager of The Depot to speak to us. He shared with us that their will be 3 stages to The Depot ♦s development. The first was the restaurant, the second is construction of a 2-story event center and the third is a roof-top patio at the event center. The event center is scheduled for completion in April 2022.

Management at the Depot would like to host our club ♦s weekly club luncheon meetings and has a space on the second floor which can accommodate 80 people and has its ♦ own bar and restrooms. We would be separated from the rest of their patrons, seated on the first floor.

Currently The Depot is open from 2pm to 9pm and has a limited menu, due to staffing shortages. They hope to offer their full menu and begin their new hours



from 11am to 11pm, within a few weeks.

#### Program 2:

Teri House sponsored this week's speaker, Greg Duda, the Information Officer at the Hancock County 911 Center. Our 911 Center has been featured on network tv on several occasions and is considered one of the most advanced centers in the state. Our Center utilizes the Emergency Medical Dispatch System, sophisticated mapping software and pioneered Text 911. These state-of-the-art software programs provide scripted conversations with caller, which allows the 911 Center to provide a lot of needed information to law enforcement, fire, and EMS responders.

Greg encouraged everyone to go online and register with Smart 911 and create a household profile to facilitate response times, providing service providers with much of the needed information they need to efficiently respond to an emergency. It can also spare children from having to provide the relevant information if they call with an emergency. This information is kept confidential and will encompass:

- Location
- Family members at the location
- Medical information
- Medications
- Emergency contacts
- Pets
- Access codes

You can register at Smart911.com and download the app to your cell phone. When there is an emergency, seconds matter. Even though the state of Indiana pioneered Text 911 and is considered the world leader in this technology, staff will tell you that voice calls are more effective, but texting has proven to be invaluable in certain situations. Hancock County received 120 text messages last year. The Indiana 911 Centers are hoping to rollout video calling soon, which will be even more effective.

Currently the Center handles approximately 90,000 calls per year, with 80,000 being directed to the police and sheriff's departments and 10,000 to the Fire Department and EMS.
