Dave Anders sponsored this week ♦s speakers from the Indy Fuel Hockey Team. Matt Louck, Vice President of Sales, Beau Woodcock Ticket Sales Account Executive and Head Coach Doug Christiansen visited with us. Coach Christiansen is entering his 3rd season with the Indy Fuel and the 11th of his professional career. He led the Fuel, last year, to their first Kelly Cup playoffs with 37 team wins: the most wins in franchise history. Doug enjoyed a successful pro hockey career, with stints in the American Hockey League (AHL), the Eastern Conference Hockey League (ECHL) and in the European League. Coach is originally from Milwaukee and he and his family reside in Indianapolis. Coach conducted a Q&A rather than a structured presentation. He shared that:

- The Fuel's inaugural season was in 2014-2015.
- Players in the ECHL are typically between 20 and 30 years of age. Few careers go beyond age 30.
- Most players joined the ECHL under contract from either college hockey or Canadian or European youth hockey leagues.
- 50% of the ECHL players are American, that proportion drops to about 30% by the time a player progresses to the NHL.
- The Fuel just recruited, for this season, the captains of Michigan State's and Minnesota's Big Ten hockey teams.
- Fighting still exists in the game, but it has diminished somewhat, in an effort, to protect players from injury.
- Players receive health benefits, just like most businesses.
- The Fuel's opening game is Saturday, October 23, 2021, at 7pm at the Indiana Farmers Coliseum.
