### PROGRAM:

Fellow Rotarian JIM KLUSMAN has many years of experience as an airplane pilot. He served in the Air Force for 26 years and came to Purdue in 1987 as head of Air Force ROTC before becoming President of the Community Foundation of Greater Lafayette. Today he spoke to us about basic aircraft navigation. Jim flies in his own



airplane, an RV-8 which is housed at the Purdue airport. It is a two-person single propeller plane with a 180-horsepower engine. The plane cruises at a speed of 200 mph while providing excellent viewing through the plexiglass canopy. Planning a flight involves a lot of steps including determining heading and time en route; fuel consumption; weight and balance; and take-off data. A pilot uses VFR (visual flight rules) when it is easy to see landmarks on the ground or IFR (instrument flight rules) when it is not. Jim flies VFW - times when there is Very Fine Weather. There are multiple calculations needed to get from the original course direction towards the destination to the actual compass heading needed to accomplish that. For instance, a side wind requires that the plane head slightly into the wind to stay on course. Another factor

in planning the flight is wind speed which can add or subtract from air speed to give an actual ground speed. The aircraft can travel for more than three hours between fuel stops, but he prefers to keep the time under two hours between stops. Fall is a good time for flying because the weather is often stable. Jim has more than 3,800 hours of flight experience. The next time you are out on a clear day and hear a small plane engine above, give a wave. It might be Jim in that plane!
