PROGRAM:

CHRIS JOHANNSEN shared photos and memories of his month-long trip on the Russian River in 2018. This was his third trip to Russia, but the first time to see the country by river boat. He showed pictures of iconic places such as St. Basil's Cathedral in Moscow's Red Square. The exquisite architecture is breathtaking. Walls and ceilings of cathedrals were covered with beautiful fresco paintings. There are even paintings in the subway stations - this was initiated by Stalin. An elaborate lock system allows boats to travel from Moscow to St. Petersburg. The canal for the locks is eighty miles long - longer than the Panama Canal. As part of the tour, the group was divided into smaller groups so that they could visit in the homes of Russian citizens. They were served a meal and besides the

delicious food, there was also homemade vodka. Of course! They were able to visit the State Hermitage Museum in St Petersburg. It is the second-largest art museum in the world, founded in 1764. The grand Catherine Palace was the summer palace of the tsars. Helsinki is not far from St. Petersburg. While CHRIS was there, Putin and Trump were meeting at the Presidential Palace. The photos indicate that Russia is a beautiful country with a rich cultural history.
