PROGRAM:

Jessica Morin is the Administrative Director of Community Cancer Network.

This organization was started in 1997 by five local doctors who noticed that their patients were not responding well to treatment. It was determined that the cause was stress related to non-medical issues. These doctors invested their own money to start CCN. It

is now funded through grants, donations and fundraising events. Jessica began working at CCN three years ago and at that time they were seeing six to ten new clients per month. Now the number is closer to forty per month. They serve Tippecanoe County and ten surrounding counties. They provide a



food pantry, a wig salon, fuel cards, pet food and ride services for their clients. A large number of volunteers help with all of these efforts. One distinction of the CCN food pantry is that the food is packaged and brought to the client's car. Often the client is too weak to carry the groceries. CCN also receives and shares items such as wheelchairs, shower chairs, canes and other durable medical equipment. Their three fundraising events are a prom held in April; Carry the Torch on the last Sunday of September; and Hope on the Horizon Festival of Trees Gala in November.
