PROGRAM:

Paul Bercot from Purdue Research Foundation (PRF)



spoke to us about the Discovery Park District. This is the area on the southwest side of Purdue, south of State Street and to the east and west of Route 231. This property was previously owned by the university but was part of a land swap that took place a few years ago between Purdue and

PRF. A lot of development is already taking place in this area and much more is planned. The goal is to create a "live, work, play" environment with residences, offices, as well as restaurants and bars. Immediately to the east of 231 will be a green space that provides a buffer between the highway and the residential area. Provenance is the section with single family homes as well as condos and apartments. Many have already been built. Aspire is a completed building which is geared for student living. Convergence is a five-story office building under construction. Continuum will be a residential building and is intended for young professionals or empty nesters. The aerospace district includes the airport, the Rolls Royce building and the new Saab building. The expansion of the railroad underpass on Newman Road paved the way for Saab and other future development. This new "front door" area for Purdue

will appeal to a variety of people and will provide opportunities for growth at the university for years to come.
