PROGRAM:

DAN BERGER first experienced sailing during his grad school years when some friends invited him to go out on Lake Michigan in a 17' Thistle sailboat. He was hooked and has enjoyed sailing ever since. Ancient cultures such as the Egyptians, the Phoenicians, the Greeks and the Romans used sailboats for exploration. Sail boating for sport started about 350 years ago when the king of England raced on the Thames River in London. Sailboats vary in size from 4 ft long to 439 ft long. The Royal Clipper is an example of such a large boat with five masts and is used for tourism. The longest privately-owned boat is 289 ft long and is named the Maltese Falcon. Some of the names of different types of sailboats are Viking ships, Chinese Junk, Spanish Galleon, sloop, and dhow. A catamaran is a sailboat with two parallel hulls. A trimaran has three. A ketch has two masts. DAN's personal boat is a Catalina Capri 22. Because of new designs, racing boats are able to travel at a rate of 30 knots per hour and even 48 knots per hour (55 mph). One interesting story that DAN told was of a Swedish king who, in 1628, commissioned a boat to be built named the Vasa. Unfortunately, this boat sank after only thirty minutes on its maiden voyage and was a source of much embarrassment to Sweden. Happy Sailing, DAN!
