Coach looks to Rotarians to build homecourt advantage

IU Women's Associate Basketball Coach Glenn Box came to this week's Rotary luncheon on a recruiting trip. He was out to recruit Bloomington Rotarians as fans for the No. 8-ranked Hoosiers.

"Our program has been on the rise," Box said. The 2020-21 team finished 21-6 overall and 16-2 in the Big Ten and made it to the Elite Eight. "With everyone back from last year's team and with some talented newcomers, this year is going to be something truly special," he said. "We want you, your passion, and your energy. You can give us a true homecourt advantage."

After hosting UINDY in the Nov. 5 season opener, the Hoosiers will play at Butler Nov. 10 before hosting highly touted Kentucky Sunday, Nov. 14, before a national audience on ESPN. Rhyne Howard, who led UK to a come-from-behind win over the Hoosiers last year, is expected to be the No. 1 pick in the 2022 WNBA draft.

"We've beefed up our schedule," Box said. The Hoosiers are expected to be in a three-way fight with Maryland and Ohio State for the Big Ten title. Outside the conference, IU will play No. 1 Stanford in the Bahamas on Thanksgiving Day and North Carolina State, a top-seeded team that IU upset in the Sweet Sixteen last spring in San Antonio, on Dec. 2.

IU returns all of its starters from 2020-21, including guards Grace Berger, Ali Patberg, and Nicole Cardaño-Hillary; forward Aleksa Golbe; and 6-3 center Mackenzie Holmes.

During the Q&A, **Tim Jessen** asked Coach Box about IU player Kiandra Browne of Montreal, who showed up to show her support for the members of the Islamic Center of Bloomington after vandals damaged the facility last month.

"Kiandra fits our culture," Box said. "Coach Moren preaches selflessness, love, taking care of one another. For a lot of our players, their faith in God is extremely important to them. That's certainly true here."
