Our Program: Judy DeMuth



For the second week in a row, a Bloomington Rotarian was the featured speaker. **Judy DeMuth**, superintendent of the Monroe County School Corporation, will be retiring after 10 years at the helm. She stayed on an extra year to deal with the coronavirus epidemic, which she called the most difficult thing she has had to address in her 45 years in public education.

A comprehensive re-entry and recovery plan, designed by 40 representatives (including administrators, the school board president, teachers, staff, students, health care professionals, and community members), provided overall guidance. A metric committee, comprised of doctors, epidemiologists, nurses, health care professionals, staff, teachers, parents, community members, and representatives of the county and state health departments, meets weekly to evaluate how

things are going. Drs. Lindsay Weaver and Kris Box from the state health department are particularly important members.

Judy's No. 1 priority has been the education of the children. Providing that, however, has been difficult when she also has to pay attention to the emotional wellness of both teachers and students. Buildings were closed from mid-March to the end of July.

She led the audience on a chronological tour through MCCSC's handling of the pandemic. She sought the advice and input of many groups and individuals including parents, teachers, both the state and county boards of health, and community members, as well as state education officials, including Jennifer McCormick, Indiana's last elected Superintendent of Public Instruction.

Personal protective equipment and cleaning supplies had to be ordered, and social distancing had to be implemented and maintained.

Among the policies that have been adopted are contact tracing seven days a week; keeping students in small groups; and closing doors to parents, visitors, and outside groups.

"Trying to create a semblance of normal school activities while taking needed precautions for staff and students in wearing masks, handwashing, social distancing, continued deep cleaning, and other precautions to keep students and staff safe": this has characterized Judy's overall handling of the challenge.

Schools today do more than educate, she reminded Rotarians. They also feed needy children and provide daycare to parents who must work. These have been especially challenging in the time of the pandemic.

She also reviewed the search process for her successor, who is scheduled to be named by the middle of next month.
