ShelterBox Team Member Gives Org Background to Greensburg Club



Sharee Sheets, president of the Peoria North, Arizona, Rotary Club and a Team Member with ShelterBox, teleconferenced with Greensburg Rotarians to give background and information on ShelterBox's global actions to accomplish their mission to provide emergency shelter to families who have lost their home to disaster or conflict, enabling them to rebuild their lives.

ShelterBox began in 2000 when the Rotary Club of Helston-Lizard, in Cornwell, England, was inspired to make a tangible difference in the lives of people who were left with nothing after a disaster. They established ShelterBox with an initial goal of assisting eight to ten families by providing a box containing a family-sized

tent, sleeping bags, water purifying tablets, trenching tool and pots and pans. Rotarians worldwide stepped up to support the idea, contributing over \$115K in the first year. This enabled ShelterBox to respond to its first-ever aid event, the 2001 earthquake in Gujarat, India.

With the support of Rotary members and clubs around the world, ShelterBox grew to become an independent, registered charity in 2003 and an internationally recognized, disaster relief organization nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize in 2018 and 2019. Since 2012, ShelterBox and Rotary International (RI) have been official Project Partners in disaster relief. Sheets pointed out, however, that ShelterBox doesn't receive funding from RI, but, instead, from individual Rotarians and Rotary clubs - over \$48M to date. She stressed that they also often rely on Rotarians in disaster areas to provide information, arrange transportation, and support team members with shelter and food. In fact, about 90% of ShelterBox deployments involve local Rotary clubs.

Sheets went on to say that ShelterBox teams have to work efficiently and effectively to best allocate

available resources where they're most needed. As a result, they've moved from providing boxes with pre-established materials to providing palletized aid materials based on the needs of the particular country and disaster. They identify these needs by asking the local population what they need. Then they get the materials into areas often overlooked by other relief organizations, moving supplies by plane, boat, cart, or even handcarried! ShelterBox team members also consistently work with families receiving aid to identify lessons learned that will help the organization better

meet its goal for the next disaster or conflict. Recipients have given great praise to ShelterBox and the materials it provides, saying the shelters become a home where they can rest and spend time with family. The shelters also allow them to return to work quicker, bolstering their family income and the local economy post-disaster. Some even recycle

Sheets concluded by saying that conflicts prove to be the events that drive long-term relief needs. While a natural disaster, such as the earthquake in Haiti, is a singular event, conflicts last for years. She pointed out that ShelterBox has been providing aid in Syria since 2012, helping over 400K people, and in the Chad Basin since 2015.
