"FULFILLMENT: Winning & Losing in One-Click America"



SPEAKER: Alec MacGillis, Author

Alec will speak to his book, FULFILLMENT: Winning & Losing in One-Click America, and describe it as being about the country's growing disparities between winner-take-all cities like Seattle, San Francisco, Boston, New York and Washington, D.C., on the one hand, and the much larger group of cities and towns that are being left behind in an economy dominated by a handful of tech giants. The book tells this story of growing disparity through the frame of Amazon, and it includes a chapter on Dayton's transformation from a hub of manufacturing innovation to a city that is

increasingly given over to the logistics industry. He will speak to the nationwide context of the book but will end up focusing a fair amount on Dayton.

She coordinated the Dayton Bike Share and Link within Dayton and the smart bike program. Laura is graduate from UD and formerly served as ED of UpDayton. Laura was recently engaged **O**Congratulations!

May is Bike Month and with that in mind, Laura shared what is happening around the Miami Valley and what is going with Bike Month. Bike Miami Valley s mission is to advocate, promote and create opportunities for all forms of cycling in the region. They offer variety of services cycling safety class, resource hub, advocacy, bike parking experts. Dayton was the 32nd City to launch in the US. Laura mentioned that some groups are doing a group ride. Laura shared they have expanded the Link bike locations throughout Dayton and open this week. Dayton is the largest paved trail network with over 350 miles of trails to ride. They do offer annual passes for \$90 and in the next week they are offering \$15 off. 
The Virtual Convention will be open to all Rotary members and participants. Event registration will open in mid-April and will include a promotional fee of \$49 for 21 days, with an
