### "The Boonshoft School of Medicine: Past, Present and Future"

The Boonshoft School of Medicine graduated its first class in 1980. It has seen many changes over the years, including a name change from the Wright State University School of Medicine to its current Wright State Boonshoft School of Medicine. It has seen its class size increase from 32 to over 120. A further increase to 150 is in consideration.

The Boonshoft School of Medicine is proud of its role in the Miami Valley community and as well of its graduates that have assumed health care leadership roles throughout the country. ### This Happened Last Monday...

Rotary President Shaun Yu called the meeting to order after some small technical glitches! The meeting was at capacity live and in person for the first time in a long time. He turned the meeting over to Bill Nance who led us in a special giving thanks prayer, the Four Way Test, the Pledge and news of the day where we learned about increasing food prices for the second month in a row.

Kim Bramlage introduced us to the Club's guests for the day and told us about the Muse Machine's upcoming performance of The Addam's Family on January 14, 2022. We wished Mike Houser a happy birthday. Day 10's included \$250 from Mike Houser for his birthday, Matt Jessup announced a Day 50 for finalizing the expansion of his company and a ribbon cutting ceremony on December 2nd; Shaun Yu a Day 20 for a job opening at his station for a Development Director; Dick Hattershire 2 Day 100's in honor of the Bach Society of Dayton and the upcoming Paul Lawrence Dunbar Day; Dave Williamson a Day 15 for birthdays celebrated on November 15 his mother's and his daughter's.

The Chair of the Day, Dr. John Lyman, introduced us to Lisa Henderson who serves as the Vice President of Health Initiatives for the Greater Dayton Area Hospital Association (GDAHA). Lisa is a Cincinnati native and obtained her undergraduate degree from Xavier and her Masters from Xavier in Hospital Administration. She served at Dayton Children's Hospital for 15 years.

Lisa devotes her time at GDAHA in assisting those making end of life decisions through the Decide to Be Heard initiative. The mission of the initiative is to empower citizens to openly discuss those decisions with family members and medical professionals. The Program has over 100 facilitators who are certified by GDAHA who prompt the necessary discussions with people. The facilitators are not all medical professionals but they all serve to ensure that the person's wishes are documented and that all end of life concerns and goals are considered. The facilitators all realize that these are not easy conversations to have but they are ever so important. Most (90%) people agree how important it is to discuss a plan regarding end of life issues, but few (30%) actually do anything about it.

The promises made by the program include initiating a discussion, provide assistance and to make sure the person's plans are secured. This can be by directing folks to the necessary advanced directive documents including a health care power of attorney, living will and DNR. One goal is to normalize the process so it doesn't seem as daunting.

The process is to have people focus on their goals, values and beliefs about end-of-life decisions and to share them with family and those that need to know and carry out their plan. Others that provide crucial services through the program are Kay Wyse, a medical social worker and Dr. Richard Gregg, an intensive care physician. There is a concerted effort to encouraging doctors to be champions of Advanced Care Planning (ACP).

Lisa stressed that indecision is actually a decision and that physicians and hospitals see the detrimental effects on patients who are in the hospital and have not had the discussion. She directed us to the You Tube and website to learn ways to have the conversation. Lisa entertained questions from the Club which focused on the fact that anyone can obtain the ACP forms online and you don't necessarily need an attorney to complete the forms. The group also discussed what people and entities should have copies of the ACP documents, including providing a copy to the hospital where treatment is rendered so that there is a copy in the medical records.

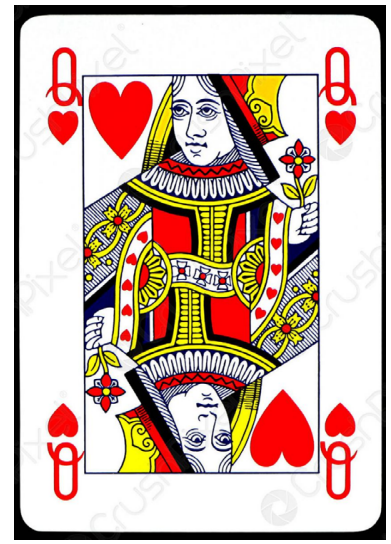
