"How Rotary Influenced My Life Trajectory"



Speaker: Heather Hilt

Heather Hilt was a two-time Rotary Youth Exchange Student. She traveled to Ukraine in the Summer of 2005 and to India for the school year from 2007-2008. Her family also hosted a Rotary Exchange student from Brazil in 2004. Her cross-cultural connections lead her down a path of embracing the service above self-mantra. From learning first-hand about political violence in Ukraine to administering Polio Vaccinations and camping with the future Prime Minister of India, Rotary International Youth Programming gave Heather Hilt wings and a jet engine to navigating her future life and career choices.

President Shaun then returned to the podium and thanked Bill Weaner for joining us via Zoom. Bill had some emergency heart procedures last week and is now at home recuperating for a few weeks. We are all sending our well-wishes to him for a full recovery.

Other President's news - The Legion of Honor luncheon is coming up and our club has two more tickets at the table. Let Laura know if you are interested in attending.

Frank Scott presented Paul Harris Fellowships to these generous donors: Annie Foos (red ribbon member) - 1st PHF, Lisa Grigsby - 1st PHF and Greg Birkemeyer (Past DG) - 5th PHF. And Greg then presented Brian and the Club with its 2021 Presidential Citation for meeting many goals and objectives over the past Rotary year.

Next, Amada Burks introduced our speaker, Bethany Deines, Director of Development at Shriners Children's Ohio. Bethany's role includes strategic initiatives, community engagement and fundraising for the hospital. Bethany explained that Shriners moved from its previous stand-alone location in Cincinnati to the Dayton Children's facility here for several reasons - kids don't stay in the hospital as long as they used to and the Cincy location was much too big (with too many inpatient beds) so the Dayton location is just the right size for the number of inpatient beds needed. In addition, being in Dayton allows for shared services, world-class providers and a family-friendly environment in an ideal location. They needed a smaller footprint, and lower overhead, to continue to serve patients in need more efficiently and effectively.

Shriners serves patients from the entire Midwest and mid-Atlantic regions of the US, along with international patients from around the world. It is a verified burn center (one of 21 in the country) with many wrap-around services. They perform many procedures, focusing most on burns and plastic surgery for children to age 18 (up to 21 years old in some circumstances). And, Shriners partners with the Ronald McDonald House here in Dayton.

Many of their patient success stories, along with all of their services and information, are featured on their website, shrinersohio.org.

Great job, Bethany! We learned a lot about Shriners and enjoyed hearing the latest information.

President Shaun adjourned the meeting after reminding us that the speaker for Oct. 11 is Heather Hilt, a two-time Rotary Youth Exchange student. Her presentation is entitled "How Rotary Influenced My Life Trajectory". RSVP to attend in person, or join us via Zoom next Monday!
