How we strive for safety with in-person Rotary meetings

Guidelines for Letters

Address the letter using a more generic salutation such as �Dear Hero� or �Dear Service Member� since the letter can go to a soldier, sailor, marine, Coastie, airman or guardsman.

Be gender neutral since you don t know the gender of the recipient.

Specific references to religion are not permitted since there is no way we would know the religious beliefs of any particular military member and because Blue Star Mothers is a VSO chartered by Congress - e.g. inclusion of long prayers, citing of religious literature such as Bible verses, etc. A simple �you are in my thoughts�, �you are in my prayers, or bless you are okay.

If children are sending pictures or notes, please ask them to include their first name only and their age - do not include last name or address.

Academic Allies is an opportunity for volunteers with academic subject matter expertise to get involved and make a difference with students, parents, and teachers in Westerville City Schools. Learn more about the program and watch a video about Academic Allies here: www.westervilleeducationfoundation.com/academic-allies This program allows community volunteers with content knowledge and/or teaching experience to make a significant impact on the life of a child as they navigate this challenging time of remote learning.

Teachers, school administrators and guidance counselors identify students who are eager to learn but struggling with remote learning. As an Academic Ally, you will be paired up with one student who will benefit from your experience and your knowledge of the subject matter that is most challenging for them. You and your student meet during mutually agreed upon times for live, virtual conferencing sessions. A commitment of 2-4 hours weekly is recommended. Security procedures are in place to ensure the safety and security of students and volunteers.

There is no cost to participate; however, all Academic Allies volunteers must have the technical equipment/internet connection to support video conferences with your student via Skype, Facetime, Zoom or other platform.
