The new International President, Shaker Metta, stated that membership development

should be Rotary's highest priority. His guiding mantra for the year is to "Do more, Grow more." He believes we can grow much larger with simple membership goals and focusing on regional plans, successfully transitioning Rotaractors into Rotary Clubs, and increasing diversity and female members. He says one way to reach this goal is "Each One Bring One."

The six original areas of focus are: Promoting Peace, Fighting Disease, Clean Water, Mothers and Children, Supporting Education and Growing Local Economies. The new 7th area of focus is "Each One Bring One."



Dylan reported that our club lost 8 members this year due to the shakeup from Covid. We currently have 92 members with two soon-to-be members. He invited each member to take part in a short written exercise to help focus on his/her Rotary connection. The exercise helped members to focus on their personal relationship with Rotary in order to better share their stories with prospective members.

Dylan mentioned that in the past goals have been set for a total increase of 3-5 members per year. This year the goal is to add nine members to bring the total to 103. As a little bonus each month, the district will be collecting the names of all Rotarians who brought guests and will hold a monthly drawing where the winner will have a charitable donation made by the district in his/her honor.

As everyone knows, Peace is passion for District Governor Maryjane. Over the next year, four Peace Symposiums are planned. Stephanie Freas announced that the first one is scheduled for Saturday, September 25th.



Dylan noted, as reported by Doug, that the 125 Club consisted of 29 members this past year. The goal for this year is 60 members. Dylan presented his check for \$125 to Doug to join the club and receive one of the new pins created by our

new District Governor MJ.

Dylan announced that the club will continue its pop-up projects this year. Keely and her crew have already started working on the July project. Starting in August, there will be no meeting on the last Thursday of each month in order to devote time toward service. On those days the plan is to meet up for an informal social in the evening around 6:00 p.m. for a bit of fellowship. More details on that to come.




For the past few years Joey Osborn has done a great job at keeping up with posting club news. Currently, there are 1000 people who like our page. Increasing that number could result in a boost for our fundraising events. To prepare for that opportunity, Dylan would like to create a Social Media Committee so that a different person would take over the account each month to share their Rotary stories in creative ways. He invited interested members to stop at the back table and add his/her name to the committee list.
