Speaker District Governor Maryjane Shackelford



came to tell us about her and the district. You should sign up for the Rotary International Conference June 4 to 8 in Houston. A great experience every Rotarian needs to do at least once. Everyone should donate to the foundation as that is where the grants come from. A suggested \$100 per year per member. Also join the 125 club by donating \$25 to Polio Plus. Maryjane is from Zanesville and joined a new club because her father said so. The national Commander wants to grow Rotary from 1.2 to 1.3 million members this year. The motto of "Each One Bring One" is promoted throughout Rotary. District 6690 has about 3,200 members but we lost 188 last year. To help the National commander the 59 clubs in our district need to gain 475 member or 8 per club. In 26 years our club has donated \$271,900 to the Rotary Foundation. Last year we donated over \$18,000 to Polio plus. This year there have been only 2 cases of polio reported. If every member in 6690 district donated \$25 we would

raise \$81,000. Our club is a Peace Builder Club and she is trying to get all district clubs to be one. So far she has 32 of the 59 clubs. She mentioned the Friendly Candle Company in Zanesville is selling candles to promote Rotary and the Peace Builder project. Get a candle at
