Following a spring presentation to the Club by Ronnie Williams about graffiti art in the City of Portsmouth, the Board of Directors decided to commission the Portsmouth Street Art Project to paint the storage trailer with grafitti images of various Rotary activities. The trailer will receive annual public attention when it is temporarily relocated to the Roy Rogers Esplanade during our annual Fish Fry in early September, during the annual Portsmouth

River Days Festival.

One side of the trailer will contain images of Portsmouth Rotary Club activities, while the other side will highlight activities of Rotary International.



This commisisoned artwork represents not only a partnership between the PSAP & Rotary, but provides Rotary with yet another opportunity to support positive activities in our community!

NOVEMBER 15 GUEST SPEAKER - PEGGY RICE

Our guest speaker on Monday, November 18 was *Peggy Rice*, Executive Director of the Portsmouth Metropolitan Housing Authority (and fellow Rotarian!).

Peggy updated the club on the progress on the construction of the Hisle Park Apartments on Thomas Avenue in Portsmouth. When completed, Hisle Park will provide transitional housing for adults age 18-24 who have aged out of the foster care system. One, two and three-bedroom apartments will be provided at low cost to the residents as they transition into the workforce and pursue a more stable living and working environment. Nationwide, there are over 500,000 youth currently in the foster care system.

Our own president, Dan Simco and his wife Misty are currently foster

What is a PAUL HARRIS FELLOW?



The Paul Harris Fellow recognition acknowledges individuals who contribute, or who have contributions made in their name, of \$1,000 to The **Rotary Foundation.**

Rotary established the recognition in 1957 to encourage and show appreciation for substantial contributions to what was then the Foundation s only program, Rotary Foundation

Fellowships for Advanced Study, the precursor to Ambassadorial Scholarships.

The first Paul Harris Fellows included past RI Director Allison G. Brush, who served during the 1937-38 Rotary year, and longtime RI Treasurer Rufus F. Chapin, both for donations made in 1946. Mrs. Adan Vargas was the first woman to receive the recognition, for a gift made in 1953. Mrs. Harry L. Jones was the second, and one of only five people recognized for contributions actually made in that inaugural year.

Early Paul Harris Fellows received a certificate of recognition. In 1969, the Foundation unveiled the first Paul Harris Fellow medallion at the Rotary Convention in Honolulu, Hawaii, USA. Japanese metal artist Fiju Tsuda created the piece under the direction of former Foundation Trustee Kyozo Yuasa. Today, Paul Harris Fellows receive a certificate and pin. They are also eligible to buy a Paul Harris Fellow medallion.
