

A native of Louisville, Jim Holmberg is the Curator of Collections at the Filson Historical Society. He received his BA in History and MA in American History from the University of Louisville. Jim is a former History instructor at the University of Louisville and for the continuing education program at Bellarmine University.

James H. Mulligan undoubtedly spoke truth when he proclaimed that the "sun shines ever brightest" and the "song birds are the sweetest" in his famous 1902 poem "In Kentucky." And he wasn't far off the mark when he also proclaimed that "politics - are the damnedest." That also can be said to be true for the rest of the country; especially as it applies to presidential campaigns. The highest office in the land is on the line and whether a Democrat, Republican or member of another party with a candidate vying for the White House, you want your person to win. And to do that, you didn't necessarily play nice or play fair. The current 2020 contest is no exception.

This brief overview of U.S. presidential campaigns focuses on some of the more memorable contested campaigns for the office of President of the United States. The overwhelming consensus that George Washington should be our nation's first president quickly dissolved and political parties formed as different political philosophies and goals for the country emerged. The September 17th Rotary Club of Louisville meeting featured Dr. Erica Sutton, president and founder of Surgery on Sunday Louisville (SOSL). The topic of Dr. Sutton's presentation was "The effects of the COVID-19 crisis on health equity and who it is affecting in the Southeast."

Surgery On Sunday Louisville is a nonprofit founded in 2013 to provide free surgery to people who are uninsured or under-insured. With the aid of over 500 volunteers, SOSL has provided much



needed surgical care to over 800 people in its six-year history. The organization has sponsored activities in three states - Kentucky, Indiana, and Massachusetts and soon to be Georgia.
