## Medical transport membership program

You never know when a medical emergency will arise. But when it does, time and access to world-class patient care can mean everything. That's why an AirMedCare Network membership is so important. Air Evac Lifeteam recently increased its coverage in Tennessee with a new base in Clarksville. Officials said the new base, which opened on April 2, will ensure even more residents in the region will have access to lifesaving emergency medical care. The base is located on Guthrie Hwy. in Clarksville.

Bob Rowland, program director for the state's 14th Air Evac Lifeteam location, said the Clarksville air medical base and crew will serve patients within a 70-mile radius.

Air Evac Lifeteam is the nation's leading provider of helicopter air ambulance services. Crews provide on-the-scene medical care, rapid medical transport and transfers between medical facilities. An Air Evac Lifeteam crew, which includes a registered nurse, paramedic and pilot, is on duty seven days a week.

Air Evac Lifeteam is a membership-supported air ambulance service that is part of the AirMedCare Network. AirMedCare is America's largest air medical transport membership network, providing emergency access to the highest levels of care for its 3 million subscribers. The AirMedCare Network combines the membership programs of three leading air ambulance operators: Air Evac Lifeteam, Guardian Flight, REACH, and Med-Trans Corporation. ## Rotary helping dreams come true



A well known quote from the movie “Field of Dreams,” perfectly describes the Clarksville Rotary Field of Dreams: “If you build it they will come.”

Dozens of people showed up for the ribbon cutting Friday of the Rotary Field of Dreams and ADA compliant playground at Civitan Park.

The field and playground is part of funding for a 25-acre expansion of Civitan Park that was made available in 2017 for Montgomery County to help address overcrowding and to enhance the quality of life and well-being of special needs children and their families.

The three Rotary Clubs in the city, Clarksville Rotary, Sunrise Rotary and Sunset Rotary, also helped provide funding for the community service project, calling it The Rotary Field of Dreams. A grant was also provided by the Clarksville-Montgomery County Community Health Foundation.

“This is something our community has needed for a long, long time, and without the Rotary Club, without the Clarksville-Montgomery County Community Health Foundation, I don’t think we’d be standing here today fixing to cut a ribbon on this field,” said Montgomery County Mayor Jim Durrett.

Rotary District 6760 Governor, Bob Huffman, said the opening of the Rotary Field of Dreams demonstrates Rotary’s commitment to making our community a better place to live and thrive, and Margaret Davis with Progressive Directions Inc. and Buddy Ball Special Needs Athletic League said the field and playground is a 20-year dream come true and Clarksville has received a wonderful gift.
