Rotarian Bill Phillips Honored with Press Box

The Lawrenceburg Rotary Club has honored longtime member Bill Phillips with the dedication of the Phillips Press Box. Phillips has served for many years as event announcer at the annual Middle Tennessee District Fair. The first event held at the club’s newly constructed grandstand was in 2014, with Phillips moving to the grandstand press box that will now bear his name.

Rotary Club Fair Manager Tad Keaton presented Phillips with the honor during the Rotary Club’s attendance at the Tennessee Association of Fairs annual convention held recently in Murfreesboro. He praised Phillips’ longtime service to the club and community.

Phillips joined the Lawrenceburg Rotary Club in 1986. He served with the Tennessee Association of Fairs from 2003 to 2010 and as association president in 2009. The association presented Phillips with its Thornton Taylor Award in 2019 that recognizes those who have supported their local fair as well as the association.

Phillips has served in many capacities with the local club, including stints as president, during the 1999-2000 and 2007-2008 Rotary Years. In addition to his Rotary volunteer duties, Phillips works with Lawrence County Skywarn and has served as the Lawrenceburg/Lawrence County’s Emergency Management Agency’s Public Information Officer since 1994.
