The State of the Nashville Hotel Industry

In 2018, a record 15.2 million tourist visited Nashville. In 2019, at least 20 new hotels are expected to open in Nashville. Jan Freitag, Sr. Vice President of Lodging Insights for STR Global, will provide insight into the Nashville hotel industry. He will discuss room rates, occupancy and the rooms in the pipeline, giving the audience good insights to the current state of the "hot" hotel sector.

Jan Freitag, is charged with exploring opportunities related to STR's development initiatives. He is the author of a recurring column on Hotel News Now, presents lodging performance trends at industry conferences and is often quoted in trade publications and the general news media.


