In the meantime, we are looking for ways to continue Nashville Rotary's mission: To impact our community by creating forums for fellowship, understanding and service among engaged leaders.



AN UPDATE ON NASHVILLE ROTARY'S DISASTER RESPONSE:

March 23--Update

Unfortunately, the Wildhorse Saloon and its kitchen is closed through April 5. We are unable to serve our planned community meal in North Nashville at this time The need in Nashville is tremendous, but fortunately so is the willingness to help. Rotarians are community leaders looking to make an impact on our community through service.

- 1. We were awarded a \$15,000 Rotary International Disaster Relief grant. We have purchased Kroger gift cards that will be distributed in the North Nashville community.
