Q and A: RECRUITING NEW MEMBERS

Q: Why do we need more members?

A: As a club, we average about 10% attrition, which means that we need nearly 50 new members each year to maintain our club size.

Q: What is the criteria for membership?

A: Leaders making a difference” guides our thinking. “Leadership” can mean senior or executive management or someone who has received recognition for work within their field. “Making a difference” aims at people who have a demonstrated commitment to civic engagement.

Q: So, now that I have someone in mind who would be a great Rotarian, what’s next?

A: Invite the prospective member to a meeting. If they are interested, direct them to the on-line application (www.nashvillerotary.org). Applications are reviewed and if approved, the prospective member name is published in ROTATIONS newsletter for general membership consideration. Pending no written objections are submitted within 10 days, the applicant is considered elected to membership and so notified by the Rotary Office.

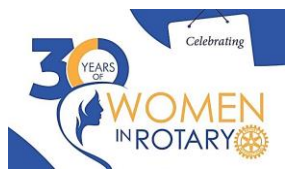

Celebrating 30 Years of Women in Rotary

Saturday, April 13, 2019, 6:00 pm, Music City Center, 201 5th Avenue South

Join us for a celebration of 30+ years of Women in Rotary. This buffet dinner will feature **PDG Sylvia Whitlock**, Rotary's first woman club president in 1987-88 and served as District 5300 Governor in 2012-13.

In 1982, the members of the Rotary Club of Duarte, CA were interested in increasing their membership with professionals in their community. One club member invited Dr. Sylvia Whitlock and two other women to be join Rotary. Requests from Rotary International to terminate the women were refused by the club, which subsequently had its charter revoked. The club renamed itself the Ex-Rotary Club of Duarte. Later a lawsuit was filed, debates followed, and in 1987, the Supreme Court ruled in favor of allowing women to join Rotary International. The Rotary Club of Duarte, CA removed the "Ex" from its name. Dr. Whitlock went on to serve Rotary at every level and has a deep commitment to the ideals of Rotary. She has written a book on her experience and has an interesting story you will want to hear!
