VIRTUAL ROTARY-APRIL 26, 2021: JOEY Garrison, Covering the white house

Joey Garrison is an awarding-winning White House correspondent for USA TODAY covering President Joe Biden. He previously reported on the 2020 campaign after working as national correspondent for USA TODAY based in Boston. From 2012 to 2019, Garrison covered city hall and local and state politics for The Tennessean in Nashville, Tenn. after working for the Nashville City Paper from 2009 to 2012. He also covered K-12 public education in Nashville for a period.

At The Tennessean, Garrison was part of a team of reporters that earned second place by the National Headliner Awards in 2019 for best political reporting for coverage of former Nashville Mayor Megan Barry's sex scandal and resignation. The Washington Post's "The Fix" politics blog named Garrison one of Tennessee's best political reporters in 2013. The Nashville Scene's "Best of Nashville" readers' poll twice recognized Garrison as Nashville's best local political reporter. Garrison is currently one of 21 journalists taking part in the National Press Foundation's Paul Miller Washington Reporting Fellowship. Garrison lives in Washington D.C. and is a graduate of Rhodes College, class of 2006.
