We will reconvene on Mon, November 19, 2018 with an observance and salute to our Veterans.

### Nashville Rotary Service Trust – Annual Footprint Fund

The Rotary Club of Nashville has a 104 year legacy of Service Above Self through both our financial support to nonprofits in Nashville and the hundreds of volunteer hours provided by our members. In last fiscal year, we awarded grants of just over \$145,000; and during this Rotary year 2018-19, we have provided grants totaling \$151,300 to nine nonprofit organizations whose missions focus in hunger/nutrition, education/literacy or housing/community building.

Over the course of this fall, we will have hosted **13 service opportunities**, which has resulted in over **164 Rotarians** committing to service above self. Your contributions, allow **42 Rotarians** to give books to children five times a year; to provide **114** backpack meals each week, and for the **3,800** holiday meals that are delivered by Rotarians in December.

To continue this legacy of service, our board of directors is asking each member to make a minimum contribution of \$500 to support our community service initiatives. This week, you will receive an invoice for this amount. Please give generously. And even if you are unable to make the full contribution, please give at a level you are able as our goal is for all members to support the Nashville Rotary Service Trust, which funds our grants and service work through the Footprint Fund.
