I Quickly Evolved Along With It"**

Seventeen years later film & TV placements serve as a critical financial solution for the streaming services setbacks. Anastasia is a music industry professional with 25 years' experience in music supervision, Television & film production, publishing, artist management, A&R and music placement. In the 1990s, Brown was one of a select group of female managers heading up the Nashville division of Miles Copeland's management company and served as an A&R consultant for his label, Ark 21 where she worked with artists such as Sting, Peter Frampton, Leon Russell, Waylon Jennings, Junior Brown, John Berry and Keith Urban.

Brown segued into music supervision and has supervised award winning films and television series including *The Shack*, *Broken*, *I Saw the Light*, *Footloose*, *August Rush*, *Steven Spielberg Presents: Taken*, *It's Complicated*, *Hot Pursuit* and *The Americans*. Additionally, she served for three years as a judge on *Nashville Star*, authored the book *Make Me A Star*.

HAVE YOU CONTRIBUTED TO THE 2018-19 NRST Annual Footprint Fund?

The Rotary Club of Nashville has a 104 year legacy of Service Above Self through both our financial support and the hundreds of volunteer hours provided by our members. In last fiscal year, the Annual Footprint Fund gave grants of just over \$145,000 which allowed our Club to provide:

- 3,800 food boxes to 1,900 recipient families
- 8,820 backpack meals for 150+ students each week
- 38,260 emergency food boxes
- 20,200 books to 4,040 students plus classroom readers
- 6,020 books to establish libraries in every classroom of two Metro schools, impacting over 600 students
- 30,000 meals to 90 students in The Joseph School in Haiti
- 45,000 books distributed to students in 40 villages of Haiti

During this Rotary year 2018-19, we have provided grants totaling \$151,300 to nine nonprofit organizations whose missions focus in hunger/nutrition, education/literacy or housing/community building.

To continue this legacy of service, our board of directors is asking each member to make a minimum contribution of \$500 to support our community service initiatives.
