Weekly Update from the Rotary Club of Nashville

MEETINGS & DUES UPDATE

Dear Rotarian,

We have some important updates to share on how we plan to carry out our mission of impacting our community by creating forums for fellowship, understanding and service among engaged leaders.

Plan for Rotary Meetings starting November 2

Mayor Cooper recently announced that Nashville will progress to Phase 3 of his reopening plan on October 1. Beginning on Monday, November 2, members will have a choice to attend Nashville Rotary meetings either in-person at the Wildhorse Saloon or virtually via Zoom. The in-person meeting option will be limited to 100 members for now, requiring an RSVP to attend. This is an evolving situation and we may need to adjust the plan should Nashville revert to a prior stage of the reopening plan.

Credit on your October membership invoice

Since meetings are being held virtually until November, you will receive a \$150 credit on your October invoice. This credit accounts for meetings being held virtually in August, September and October. Your quarterly membership invoice will be \$175 instead of \$325. If you have already paid for this quarter, the Rotary staff will reach out to you directly. The \$50 per month credit reflects the pro rata share each member pays towards the Club's cost for meals and parking. Each member received a \$50 credit on the July invoice in response to meetings being held virtually in July.

Information on In-Person Meetings

We want to assure you that the Rotary Club of Nashville is dedicated to protecting the safety and well-being of our members, speakers, Rotary staff and the staff of the Wildhorse Saloon. As such, the following safety measures will be implemented at Rotary meetings. The Rotary Club of Nashville has been actively monitoring The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines and the evolving parameters recommended by the State of Tennessee. By RSVPing for the Nashville Rotary weekly meeting, you indicate that your attendance is at your own risk and that you have not knowingly been in contact with anyone with a confirmed or suspected case of COVID-19 in the last 14 days.

You are also indicating that you are fever-free and NOT experiencing any of the following symptoms:

Subjective fever (feeling feverish/chills)

- New or worsening cough
- Shortness of breath
- Sore throat
- Muscle pain
- New loss of smell or taste
- Gastrointestinal symptoms

We ask that members do the following to keep our community safe:

- Wear a mask covering your nose and mouth while not actively eating or drinking
- Wash hands or use hand sanitizer frequently
- Maintain a physical distance of at least 6 feet from other attendees whenever possible

Lunch will be served as a plated meal. Other safety measures will be shared ahead of the first meeting. Members will be asked to RSVP on Sign Up Genius for the in-person meeting beginning the Monday afternoon ahead of the meeting date. You will receive an email when RSVPs are live and since space is currently limited, we ask that you alert the Rotary staff should your ability to attend change. Please note: you do not need to RSVP for the virtual meeting option.

Please continue to send your feedback as it is enormously helpful in determining how we continue to operate as an organization. We appreciate your support and patience as we navigate an ever-changing situation.

2020 PRESIDENTIAL DEBATE

VIRTUAL ROTARY-OCTOBER 12, 2020: BEHIND THE SCENES OF THE 2020 BELMONT PRESIDENTIAL DEBATE

Belmont University is hosting the third and final presidential debate of the 2020 election cycle on October 22, 2020 from 8-9:30 p.m. Central. The debate, which will be moderated NBC “Weekend Today” co-anchor Kristen Welker, will be divided into six segments on major topics to be selected by the moderator and announced at least one week before the debate.

All three presidential debates as well as the Oct. 7 Vice Presidential debate are sponsored and produced by the Commission on Presidential Debates. The Commission on Presidential Debates (CPD) was established in 1987 to ensure, for the benefit of the American electorate, that general election debates between or among the leading candidates for the offices of President and Vice President of the United States are a permanent part of the electoral process.

CPD’s primary purpose is to sponsor and produce the quadrennial general election debates and to undertake research and educational activities relating to the debates. The organization, which is a nonprofit, nonpartisan, 501(c)(3) corporation, sponsored all of the presidential debates in 1988, 1992, 1996, 2000, 2004, 2008, 2012, and 2016.
