Quotes on Juneteenth

Juneteenth, a holiday that commemorates the last enslaved African Americans in the United States being declared free. The Emancipation Proclamation was issued by President Abraham Lincoln on January 1, 1863, however, the news of freedom did not reach Texas until two and a half years later. It came by way of Major General Gordon Granger, who announced General Order No. 3 to the people of Galveston, Texas on June 19, 1865.

1215 - England's King John put his seal to Magna Carta, a charter of English liberties that occupies a unique place in the popular imagination as a symbol and a battle cry against oppression ♦ was sealed this day, under threat of civil war, at Runnymede.

1775 - George Washington appointed commander-in-chief of the Continental Army, the day after Congress establishes the force.

1996 - American singer Ella Fitzgerald ♦ who was known for her enormous vocal range and inventive interpretations, in both ballads and jazz improvisations known as scat ♦ died at age 79.

2007 - After more than 30 years, American game show host Bob Barker stepped down as host of The Price Is Right.
