Up Close with Maggie Sipe and Her Lemurs

Maggie Sipe, the Lead Lemur Keeper for the Tennessee Aquarium was the guest speaker via Zoom for the Rotary Club of Cleveland on April 27, 2021. Maggie joined the meeting while feeding the eleven male lemurs as members were able to watch their mischievousness along with five tortoises. Seven of the lemurs are ring-tailed while there is a pair of Red-ruffed lemurs and a pair of Red-Collared brown lemurs. Lemurs are matriarchal so to avoid all kinds of problems, the Aquarium only has males at this time. With the success rate of reproduction among lemurs, the population would grow too quickly in order for lemurs to be placed in other zoo or locations. Lemurs can have one to two babies every year in captivity under professional care.

Madagascar is famous for its lemurs as there are 110 species of lemurs across five families and 14 genera. The question was posed why lemurs have not been introduced into other countries. The answer was primarily that the only known predators to lemurs are humans. On Madagascar, there are not other predators as lemurs live among other bird and snake species only, whereas in other countries, there would be so many other types of animals that lemurs have never been introduced.

The seven ring-tailed lemurs are known for their iconic striped tails and each of them are quite fluffy. The lemurs love to fight with each other and also have a great sense of smell. They do not have a specialized diet as they will eat just about anything from leaf green to leaves, insects and chameleons.

Prior to his election to the U.S. Senate, Bill served as the U.S. Ambassador to Japan, the world st third largest economy and America sc closest ally in the region.

Bill is a life-long businessman. He started his business career with the Boston Consulting Group, where his work took him to five continents, including three years based in Tokyo, Japan. He later became a venture capital and private equity investor where he invested in and served as an executive and board member of a wide range of companies. He has served on NYSE, NASDAQ and private company boards. From 2011- 2014 Bill took leave from his business career to serve as a member of the Governor scales. Cabinet and commissioner of the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development. During his tenure as commissioner, Bill reorganized the department, eliminating over 40% of the positions and saving millions of taxpayer dollars. At the same time, the new approach helped spur the strongest economic transformation seen the taking Tennessee from an unemployment rate higher than the national average when he arrived to become the number one state in the nation for jobs created through foreign investment and being named State of the Year for Economic Development an unprecedented two years in a row during his tenure.

Bill is originally from Sumner County, Tennessee. Today, he and his wife Chrissy live in Davidson County, Tennessee. They are the parents of four children.
