Connie Gatlin, our area sultimate artistic aficionado joined us at our August 24th Rotary of Cleveland Meeting. In her presentation Art is Here, Connie wanted to bring light to a dire missing piece that our community is facing.

♦ Cleveland is a very special corner of the world...but there♦s a missing puzzle piece♦ she explained Tuesday. With a bustling and growing community as ours, it is a wonder we have yet to establish a community arts facility, one for theater and performing arts. Connie would love to see an organization built and established just for this need, one that ♦ long outlives us♦.

The vision is a space for art galleries, artist workshops, musicians to play, and subsequently store their instruments. This is an amazing outlet for our community and the growth of our arts in our area, but one that will take the effort of us all to make it happen.

In a local study conducted, there were some key themes that emerged. Respondents believe there is an active arts community in Cleveland, but they are viewed as disjointed and not very inclusive. There is certainly a need for a performance & event space that can accommodate the full extent of activities desired.

The Community Arts Plan has five cornerstones to its platform: Elevate, Convene, Nurture, Engage, and Lead. These collaborative foundations are meant to establish strategic partnerships, advocate for artists, and promote arts & culture as an integrative approach to improving quality of life and equity in Cleveland.




