The final pillar is that of Empowering Girls and Promoting Diversity. This initiative will help to ensure future women leaders access to the education, resources, services and opportunities so that they have the tools needed to succeed.

Dennis serves as the Chief Customer Officer at the State of Tennessee Department of Tourist Development. In this role, he builds customer centric strategies with the state strategies markets and tourist attractions and aligns the state strategies resources to help communities succeed.

Previously, Dennis served as the Executive Director of the Rhea County Economic & Tourism Council, Inc., a private non-profit 501 C3 agency in Dayton. Dennis led the council se economic development and tourism recruitment efforts. In this role, he created the Fish Dayton brand and leveraged Lake Chickamauga to create a tourism destination. This newly created tourism economy raised Rhea County to #1 in the state for growth in the hospitality & tourism sectors in 2018.

In 2016, Dennis served on Governor Bill Haslam s Rural Task force subcommittee on rural economic development. He also served on Governor Haslam s Project H20 board focusing on a long term plan for water stewardship in TN.

His vision to create the 330 acre Rail Hub South industrial development four years ago paved the way for the Nokian Tyres manufacturing plant that selected Dayton in May 2017. The Finnish based company will invest \$360 Million and create 400 jobs in the first phase of this project, which opens October 2019. The Nokian Tyre s facility is the largest foreign direct investment in Rhea County history and was Tennessee s second largest project announcement of 2017. Dennis regional approach to recruitment and team building proved to be the winning edge in this nationwide search.

Prior to this role, Dennis had a long successful career with the Coca-Cola Company (Atlanta based) where he managed sales & marketing in many National Accounts in the US market.

Dennis is a graduate of The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga where he received his Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration.

Dennis is a Tennessee native and currently resides in Ooltewah, TN with his wife and three daughters.


