The State of Tennessee as the Pandemic Winds Down

At our May 25th Rotary of Cleveland meeting, we had Cameron Sexton, the 83rd and current Speaker of the House in Tennessee, come join us. He gave us a briefing on where our state stands as the pandemic winds down.

Tennessee is proudly one of seven states to end up with a budget surplus as we look out onto our future post-pandemic. We didnot put businesses out during the shutdowns last year, vastly different from how other states across the country handled their economics. We ended up 10% above where we thought we would be, meaning our state got to cut some taxes instead of adding them to make up the difference.

Our state has also done a fantastic job at keeping our government lean. Other states are focused on where to cut programs to make up for lost revenue, while we have the opposite outcome, were actually experiencing growth. We currently have 16 billion in our budget, of which 29% goes towards education and human services.

Tennessee did not incur any new debt last year, and is excited to be bringing back the sales tax holiday to additionally boost and stimulate consumer spending at retail and restaurants across the state.

One area that our great state plans to pay particular attention to is workforce development. At the end of




