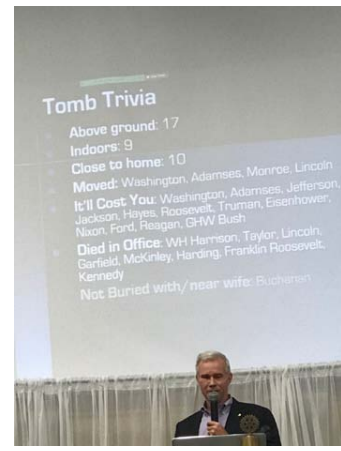

## November 11 Program: Shawna Staup with Housing United

Wednesday, November 4, 2020



Originally from Knoxville, TN, Shawna came to Cleveland in 2013 to attend Lee University, where she met her husband, Alex, who now works at Lee. During that time, Shawna began volunteering at the Cleveland Emergency Shelter, where she got to know the stories and faces of those experiencing homelessness in our community. After graduating with a Bachelor's degree in Human Development, Shawna spent 3 years serving as an AmeriCorps VISTA through United Way of the Ocoee Region. Last year, Shawna served with the local Housing Coalition and United Way to research needs and identify solutions to the homeless and housing crisis in Cleveland, ultimately leading to the development of United Way's new Housing United program. This past summer, she graduated with her Masters in Holistic Child Development, through which she studied the developmental impacts of homelessness and trauma on children. In July 2020, Shawna stepped into the full-time Housing Navigator role for Housing United.

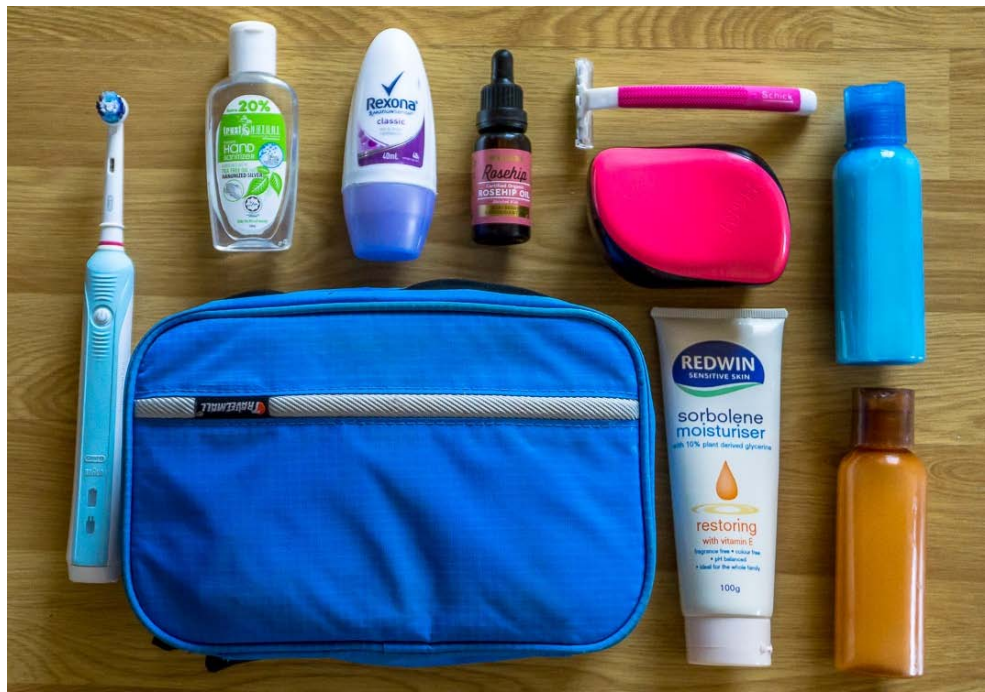

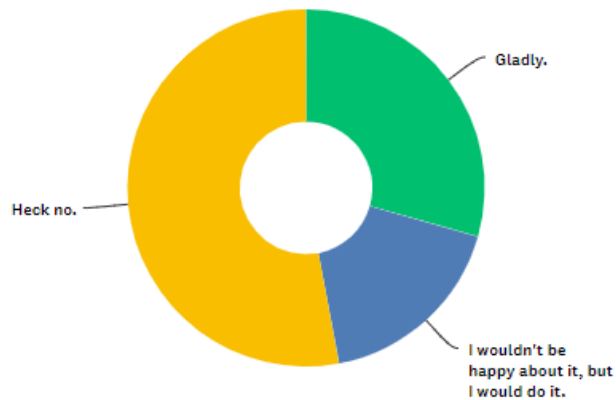


## Results from last week's trivia question: Would you accept the nomination for President of the USA?
