JROTC Is Not Just for Those Planning to Join Military

The Rotary Club of Cleveland were privileged to have representatives from the JROTC program at Cleveland High School at the November 2, 2021 meeting.

With approximately 900 JROTC units across the country, the largest number of those are in the Southeast US. Tennessee currently has 23 units with over 200 high schools on a waiting list. Bradley Central High School and Cleveland High School both have JROTC programs while Walker Valley High School is on the waiting list.

As part of the CHS program, Cadet Colonel Cahoon and Cadet Second Lieutenant Hester updated the club on the leadership development requirements and many of the programs where they are involved. Examples of those include Operation Christmas Child, the Colorguard Team, the Green Team that assists with school trash pickup, the Three Kings Feast, and the Half Marathon with Terra Running Company. Planning is also in process for the Curriculum in Action (CIA) trip to Huntsville Space Museum. Other events for the students have included Baton Death March (a 14-mile hike), the Raiders Team (a varsity sport with 32 teams and held in Soddy Daisy where CHS won 8th place), and the Color Guard Drill Team.

Cadet Hester shared about the program's markmanship and gun safety as well as the academic bowls where they participate.

Colonel Scott Campbell, Air Force Retired emphasized the positive impact of the JROTC program. The Air Force is currently in need of pilots, 250 per year. Four students from Cleveland High School have applied this year. But, Colonel Campbell reiterated that this program is not just for those wanting to go into the military. The CHS program can accommodate approximately 100 students, and their current enrollment is

Dr. Lamb is a TEDx speaker and shares in a variety of audiences including, business and not-for-profit sectors, as well as educational institutions, and churches. He is a past member of the Tennessee Governor s Commission on Volunteerism and Service.

Lamb runs marathons to support others and is on several boards and committees domestically and internationally. William and his wife Angela along with their three sons and daughters-in-law, Tyler and Megan, Nick and Katelyn, and Ben and Lexie, reside in Cleveland, TN. 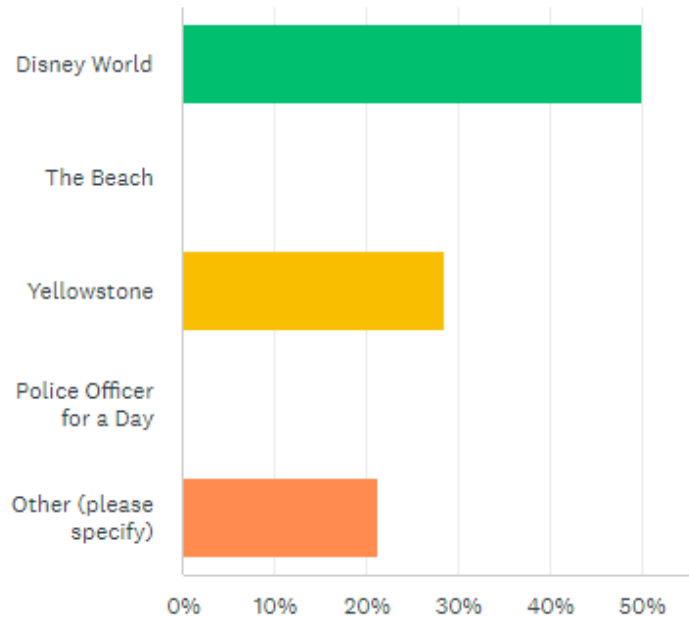
Representatives from the Cleveland High School Interact Club visited us on Novmeber 2nd to fill us in on their many ongoing and planned service projects.
