A Time to Build for the SPCA of Bradley County

Rotarian Ben Chandler introduced our program and speakers for the November 23rd program, Cathy Barrett of the Community Foundation, and Cheryl Dunson, Board Member for the SPCA.

The mission of the SPCA (Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals) of Bradley County is to provide humane enforcement and sheltering for companion animals, while providing compassionate animal services, under the No Kill Equation model. The "No Kill Equation" means that no animal is euthanized due to lack of space. For many years Cheryl worked for Santek Environmental, and she can attest that the addition of the no-kill SPCA in Bradley County reduced the amount of deceased animals going to our landfill monthly from three or four tons, to one ton.

The SPCA has begun a campaign with the help and support of the Community Foundation to build a new facility. This new facility will allow for more services, more animal housing, exam and surgery rooms, and include a Dog Run and Cat Play Room. The goal is to fund an endowment that will support ongoing expenses, provide funds for increased costs, and will grow with the SPCA.

The New Facility offers multiple give and naming donor opportunities, from Building Naming Rights of \$500,000, to Dog Kennel Naming rights of \$1,000. Ben encouraged us to consider animal lovers in our

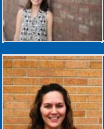

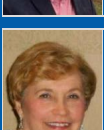

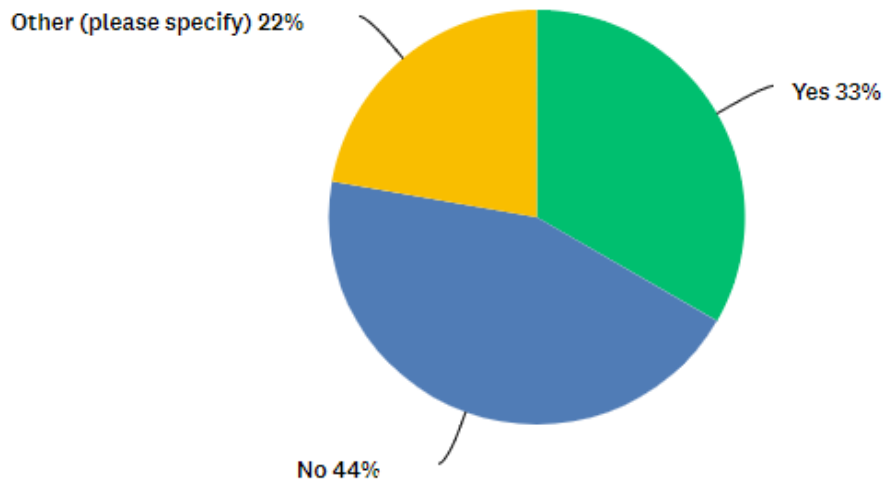
