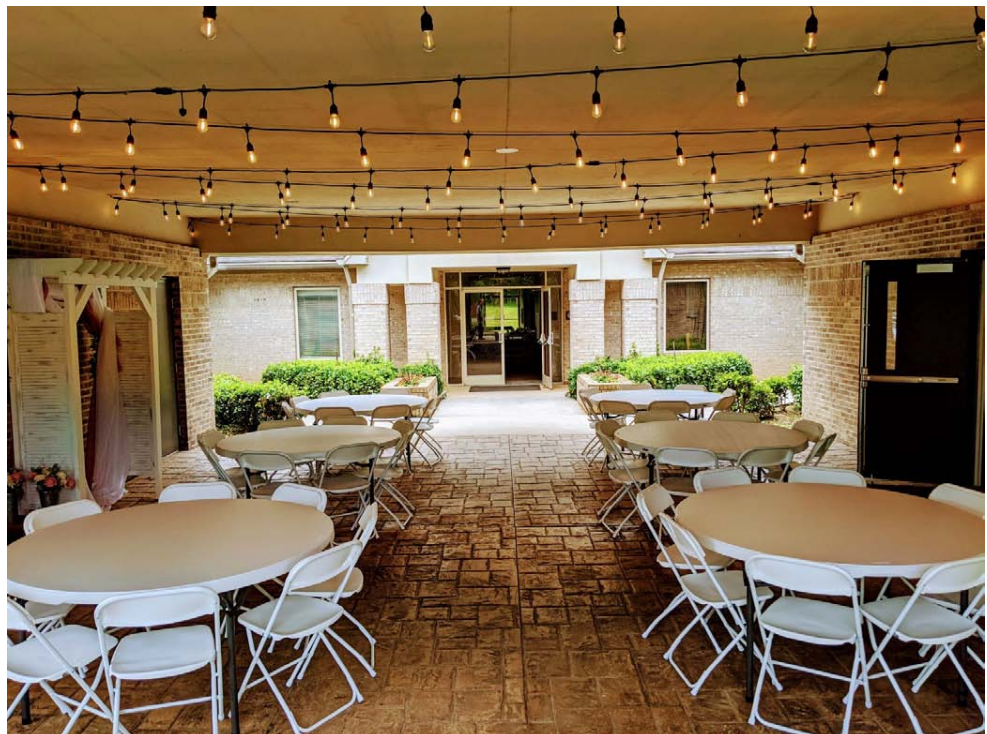

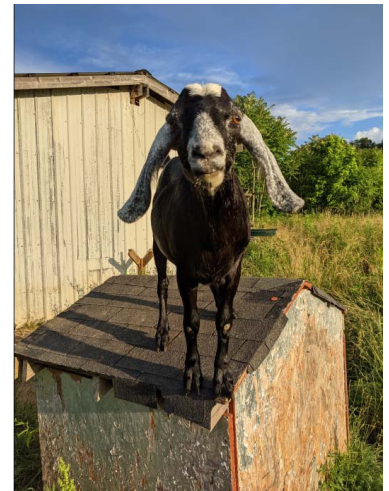


We welcome you to our home at Hiwassee Acres Lodging and Event Center for the annual Rotary Picnic!

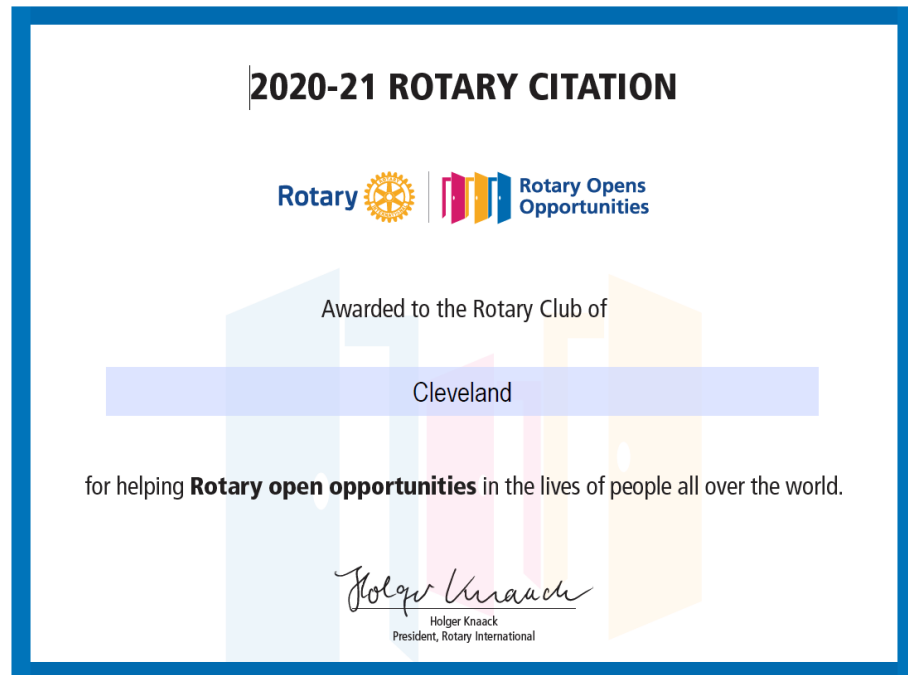

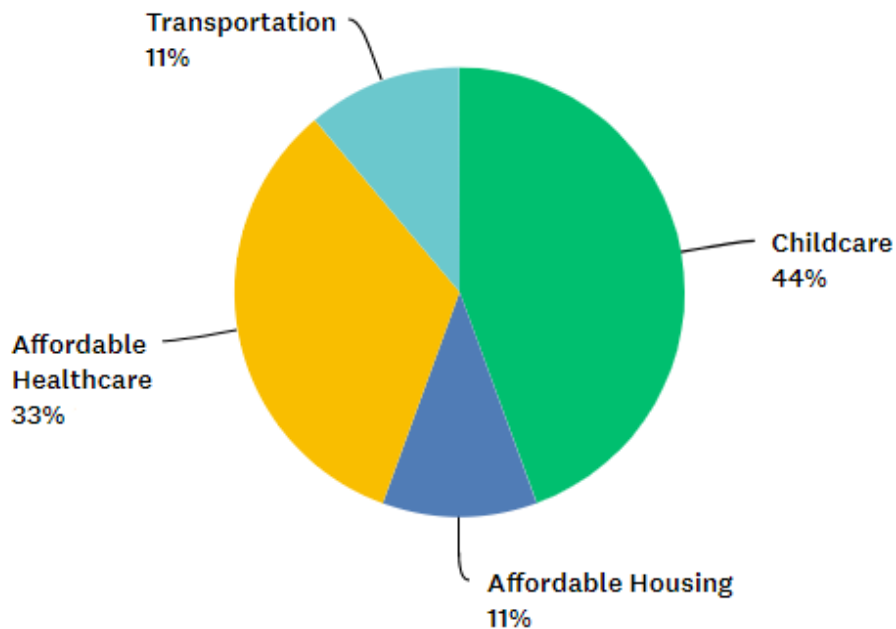
## Results from last week's poll: Which of these four impact areas would get your \$1?
