


We're thankful for the good news and prayerful for those still needing our prayers.

# Rotary Assisting in Deadly Flooding Disaster in Waverly; Hoping for Help

On August 21 flash flooding ravaged Waverly, in Humphreys County, TN. As of August 25 the death toll was 20. Homes and businesses have been lost as well as lives. On August 22 Rotarians sprang to action and have partnered with **One Generation Away** for food relief.

Dr. Michael Babb, District 6760 Governor, says they have applied for a \$25,000 Rotary grant, and feel confident that the full amount will be matched through donations. When matched dollar for dollar, the total

amount will end up being a \$50,000 grant to support all those in need. All of our district clubs will be able to help in two ways:

One Generation Away at this <u>LINK</u> will be coordinating not only for the immediate food/supplies needs, but needs for the next two years! They have

committed to 20 food drops/distributions over the next two years. "We will be asking all district clubs to donate directly to this Rotary only site to help and support those in need from Humphreys County. We already have multiple clubs throughout the entire United States wanting to donate, and now can give the above link to them," Babb said.
