Also, **PP Bob Parker** was recognized as a graduate of this year's District Leadership Academy class and **Tom Marsh** was

thanked for his hard work on the recent District Golf Tournament for Polio Plus.

Greg Maciolek presented the John Germ Humanitarian Award to Nichols, who was clearly caught off guard. "Bill put in 1,574 volunteer hours this year for youth exchange and I don't know what our Rotary Youth Exchange program would do without him. You change kid's lives," he said. Germ, of Chattanooga, is a Past President of Rotary International.

Nichols, in accepting, said: "These are my kids. I love them all and do everything I can to help them." Nichols is chair of the D6780 Outbound RYE program but works with the overall program. Maciolek said that Bill even used his own credit card to help these students get home this year in the middle of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Nichols, fighting back tears, added: "There are a lot of people who are involved with the Rotary Youth Exchange program who give a lot of hours each year to make the Exchange Program happen....It has been very special to me because these young people have become my kids as I watch them grow into adults. One thing all of them will tell you is the Rotary Youth Exchange year has been the highlight of their life so far and how much it changed their lives. It is members of our Farragut club who have been host parents, or a counselor or serving on the Youth Services committee who have made the program meaningful to me. Members of our Club have become part of this global Rotary program. Without them none of this would happen."

King won his 10th Lacy Bomar award for the Best Electronic club bulletin. The runner-up was the Rotary Club of Knoxville.

"It was a tremendous honor to accept the awards on behalf of our club. The awards are a result of the hard work, commitment and dedication of our club and our members," PP Staci said. "Congratulations to Bill Nichols for receiving the John Germ Humanitarian Award and to Tom King for receiving the Lacy-Bomar Award of Excellence. I am very proud of our club's accomplishments and it was a true honor and privilege to be the president of the Rotary Club of Farragut during 2019-2020."

# Grant Project Wrapped Up for Farragut Senior Center; Installation Work Is Next

**PP Becky Duncan**, our Grants Committee chair, reports that District 6780 approved the project report and sent the \$5,750 in matching funds to our club, which will now be disbursed to the Rotary Club of Farragut Foundation and the Bearden Rotary Club. When the Farragut Senior Center is allowed to open, we will have a ribbon cutting.

With matching funds, this is an \$11,500 project - \$5,000 from our club and \$750 from Bearden.

The project includes 6 planter boxes, 8 tables with seats, including two with umbrellas, 4 patio benches, 2 outdoor baseball corn hole games, 4 corn hole games, and gardening supplies and plants.

Once the center opens Rotarians from both the Farragut and Bearden clubs will have an opportunity to participate in planting and landscaping with the seniors. A plaque will be presented and placed on the building giving recognition to the Farragut and Bearden Rotary clubs for the outdoor project.
