Hyams won the Tennessee Sportswriter of the Year award five times (1991, 2000, 2007, 2016, 2018) and has won over 30 statewide writing awards.

PP Ed is coordinating our **29th Annual Free Flu Shot Saturday (FFSS)** Day on Saturday, Sept. 25, and the Rotary Club of Farragut is responsible for two locations — Farragut High School and Hardin Valley Middle School. Ed will coordinate the event at Farragut High and Bill Rice will handle operations at Hardin Valley Middle.

"We would like to have at least 25 club volunteers at each location. All vaccines will be administered to the recipients while they're in their cars," PP Ed said. "Masks will be worn by volunteers and other protective measures as outlined by Dr. Charlie Barnett."

We need all volunteers at both sites by 7 a.m. to set up the drive-through lines and get the necessary paperwork and forms ready for those receiving

vaccinations. Our Vols will be joined by members of the two Interact clubs we sponsor at Hardin Valley Academy and Christian Academy of Knoxville.

If everything goes smoothly and quickly, we should be done by noon. This promises to be a fun day, an important signature event for our club as we support an extremely important community service.


