Meeting Notes for June 17, 2020



Rotary Meeting notes for June 17, 2020

We convened at 7:30 AM with 59 attendees, including many guests who are to receive awards and grants.

Judi Gray reported that they have produced and given away about 5000 masks. If you need masks, contact Judi. They are available in kids and adult sizes.

Sherrie reported that the Club Board has decided, in view of the uncertainty of meeting in person and sharing breakfast, that the dues for the 2020-2021 Rotary year will be reduced to \$525 (\$350 for Rule of 85 and Next Generation).

Ruby Miller noted the new board will meet on the morning of July 1, but there will be NO CLUB MEETING on July 1.

Jim Michel announced the winners of our three special awards. We will make formal presentation of the Plaques when we meet together again as a club. Emily Jernigan has been unanimously selected to be our Rotarian of the Year. She has held virtually every office in our club over the years, including our Foundation; she has been a leader in the Fellowship efforts for 15 years and is currently bringing all three Clubs together to present Flatwater Storytelling Festival, and with that spearheading work to renovate and update the Grove theater venue.

Our candidates for Service above Self were both so compelling we felt it important to present two of those awards. Becky Hook of ADFAC was recognized for her huge efforts on providing backpacks for children in need in our county and city schools. She is personally responsible for getting those supplies together, packed and distributed and has increased the number of students served from 1500 to 4500.

Janet Townsend, of TORCH was recognized for her tireless and compassionate work with the homeless in our community. She is an advocate for the homeless in every way and takes joy in helping these neighbors of ours.

Brenda Thornburgh was the winner of our Linda Brown Angel Award. Brenda has been a tireless advocate for Rotary International's Polio Eradication work, a long-time leader for Oak Ridge Rotary youth programs. This year Brenda, and sister Tammy Saylor, provided enormous support for the work Linda Brown started with Christmas Angels. Brenda's financial support and leadership have been very important to ORBRC over the years.

Jim Rushton thanked ORBRC for their outstanding support for the Community Fund this year. We presented a total of 16 grants totaling \$30,000, a 50% increase from last year. Those organizations that received grants were Blossom Center, Free Medical Clinic, Habitat for Humanity, Keystone Adult Day Care Program, Torch, Agape House, Ecumenical Storehouse, ADFAC, Boys & Girls Club of Clinch River, Friends of the Grove, ORCMA, Girls Inc., Children's Museum, Scarboro Community Alumni Association, Contact Careline, and the YWCA.
