Program:

President Tony introduced our speaker, Eddie Harrison, who is the new coordinator of the YWCA's Game Changers Program. Eddie has many years of experience in direct support services for families and children and also coaches football at CAK. Game Changers, started in 2015, is a 14 week long program that teaches middle school boys about domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking, and about how they can help prevent it. They use a relationship building model and focus on how to safely intervene in a negative situation, healthy relationships, how to be a healthy male (it's OK to cry), and to respect women and girls. Eddie is looking to expand the program in Oak Ridge and Clinton. Members asked about how the program is evaluated (pre and post-tests) and how they get participants to overcome fears about intervening (they teach how to intervene safely, such as by calling 911 or asking an adult to help). Members also offered suggestions of organizations and people who might be good resources for Eddie as he expands the program into our area.
