Artists Raise Over \$12,000 at The Oak Ridge Street Painting Festival

The Oak Ridge Club recently partnered with Roane State Community College to hold the 2020 Oak Ridge Street Painting Festival, raising over \$12,000 to fund student scholarships. Over 60 artists participated in the event held in historic Jackson Square.

Initiated in 2000,



the annual event has become an Oak Ridge tradition that provides an opportunity for local artists to showcase their talents while raising money for scholarships for students at Roane State Community College, supporting an educated workforce for the region. Artists signed up for one of several categories, including Elementary, Middle, and High School categories, along with Adult and Family. Awards were also given for Best in Show, People's Choice, and a special Heart for Heroes category, designed to provide inspiration

and create a heartfelt gesture of honor for the heroes of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Participants and spectators at this year's event also enjoyed a pop-up performance by members of the Oak Ridge Civic Music Association. Local craftspeople were on site selling unique wares during the eight hours artists had to create their masterpieces with pastel chalk on sidewalks surrounding Jackson Square.

Organizers were particularly pleased that they were able to hold the event in spite of the pandemic, during which most public events have been cancelled. Artists were spaced out in the out-of-doors and requested to wear masks at all times, and participation was limited to 60 artists.

Despite the restrictions, this year's event raised even more money than last year, totaling a little over \$12,020.
