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TODAY'S PROGRAM: INSTALLATION of OFFICERS



Installation of Claude Rhea President of the Rotary Club of Shades Valley

At the July 13, 2020 Zoomed Birmingham Botanical Gardens Meeting of the Rotary Club of Shades Valley, Claude Rhea will assume the office of President, Bob Baker will become the Immediate Past President, Lindsy Gardner will then be the Vice-President and President-Elect, and Marcus Chatterton will be installed as the new Secretary-Treasurer of our Club. District Governor Nominee Mike Wade will preside over the installation ceremony. A new Board of Directors will also be recognized.

Claude's presidency will emphasize several key goals:

- 1. The RCSV should continue its emphasis on membership, gaining traction by adding new members.
- Claude urges participation in committees, service projects and social events now in the works. Community Service Projects Director Richard Sanders plans to further the Bucket Project, Alzheimer's Project, perhaps Habitat for Humanity, Toys-for-Tots, a clothing drive for our veterans and the Greenway Project.
- We will refresh our fund-raising events while having fun, to include events suggested by our members. Consideration of a Casino Night, a Top Golf outing, a Garden Party and other substitute fundraisers is underway.

The Installation of new Officers and a Board traditionally involves the exchange of pins. This Zoomed Birmingham Botanical Gardens Meeting, the first actual meeting of persons since shutdown from COVID-19, will handle things differently in several ways. Those attending by Zoom will be projected to the screen and appear in boxes, reminiscent of Hollywood Squares.

Please wear a mask in the building unless you are eating. The club will have masks in case anyone forgets to bring their mask, hand sanitizer, gloves, a touchless registration table, and seating of only three people per table, properly distanced. Our food will be in the form of individually wrapped boxed lunches prepared by Ted's in one of three selections. Please bow or salute in lieu of shaking hands.

Here are some ways to prevent your glasses from fogging with a mask on:

Wash glasses with soap and water immediately before wearing mask.

Tuck a small tissue into the mask at the top or place folded tissue at the top of the mask and tape it there.

Slide your glasses further down your nose.

Pinch the wire in the mask to your nose.

If you feel sick, please stay home.

Consider taking your temperature at home 30 minutes before the meeting to make sure that you are in tip-top shape before meeting with your fellow Rotarians.

Entering the Gardens:

Put on your mask before entering the building.

If you don't have a mask, one will be provided to you outside the auditorium.

Consider washing your hands for 20 seconds in warm, soapy water in the restrooms before you enter the auditorium. Hand sanitizer will also be available at the registration desk.

Please stay six feet away from your fellow Rotrians as you enter and leave the auditorium.

At the Meeting:

Wear your mask except while you are eating. Masks should cover nose and mouth.

Individually packaged lunches will be available. If you specified a vegetarian or gluten free lunch, those will be marked.

Rotarians will sit 3 per round table for the meeting.

Leaving the Meeting:

Keep your mask on until you exit the building. Leave the auditorium in an orderly fashion by both rear doors Stay six feet away from your fellow Rotarians.

Reservations are <u>required</u> for meals when attending meetings until further notice. You will be given a choice of a regular, vegetarian, or gluten free meal when registering. You are encouraged to register through the DACdb system but other alternatives are available to you. All members are requested to register each week regardless of attending or not. Once you are logged-in the process is really very simple and if you need assistance in logging in we are ready to assist!
