TODAY'S PROGRAM: Heath Thompson, Rotary Global Scholar



Heath Thompson, as a Rotary Global Scholar completed a year and a half of postgraduate study at the University of Glasgow in Scotland and was awarded a Master's in Education, Public Policy & Equity, with the highest honors. He is the first in his family to earn a postgraduate degree, and he plans to share with you a bit about this experience and what it has meant to him.

He is a native of Lexington, Alabama and attended the University of Alabama for his undergraduate degree. After graduating, he worked at UA for five years as an International Education Coordinator, where he assisted hundreds of students seeking to study abroad, focusing much of his efforts on students like himself, in-state students with limited resources struggling to study abroad. Working with these students motivated Heath to better understand the connection between education and personal empowerment, how inequity limits student potential, and how policy can improve our institutions of learning. Studying at Glasgow was for Heath the perfect opportunity to do just that.



We hope Americans wear masks in public, in cities, and when close to others. Masks serve the valuable purpose of keeping our mouths shut, and this reduces respiratory droplets. Masks are a sign of courtesy to others, showing that we do not want to infect them. They stop or reduce droplets, and constantly remind us to keep social distance. Masks signify that we are not taking the pandemic lightly. Some resist and regard mask-wearing as submissive to government authority, and are right. We are in bondage to the law so that we may be free. Our religions tell us to submit to the laws of those in authority. Birmingham has an ordinance requiring that masks be worn, and other cities may adopt those ordinances in the future. It is clear from this chart that the nations using masks have better COVID-19 outcomes. The mask-wearing nations are closer to the source of novel viruses that turn into epidemics and pandemics, and they have densely populated cities. This means they have "been there and done that" regarding viruses and epidemics. We ought to benefit from their experience, as we in the USA have had more COVID-19 deaths than other nations.
