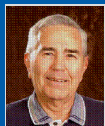

A month later my story of being a Polio Survivor was published in the international Rotarian magazine! Sharing my story with such a large audience was a brave Giant Leap for me. My passion of bringing attention to eradicating Polio was realized! Little did I know this was just the beginning of a year of leading our club to donate a total of \$89,250 to local, national, and international charities! Fundraising was a Giant Leap for me.

The year had its challenges with Breakfast meal issues and the increase of club dues, but we persevered with memorable meetings and outstanding service. We had unique speakers, snakes, new USF football coach, hypnotism, the Mayor's Visit, etc. Our biggest challenge came on March 20 when our state entered the Coronavirus Lockdown and we could no longer meet together. Our Club's decision to continue meeting on a ZOOM format was a Giant Leap for me, but probably our best meetings of the year happened in the following 12 weeks. 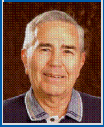

District News: Nominations for District Governor 2023-24 Now Open!

STATUS

The Governor is an officer of RI nominated by the clubs of a district and elected by the convention of RI. The governor's term of office begins on 1 July and continues for one year or until a successor is elected and qualified.

QUALIFICATIONS

In addition to the qualifications of governor nominee (below), a governor, at the time of taking office, must have completed seven years of membership in one or more clubs and have attended the governors-elect training seminar and International Assembly.

DUTIES

The district governor's responsibilities can be found in Lead Your District: Governor (233). This manual is updated annually. ([CLICK HERE FOR CURRENT MANUAL](#)) In addition to fulfilling their responsibilities, district governors are expected to adhere to the Rotary Code of Ethics.

GOVERNOR NOMINEE MUST;

1. At the time of taking office must have been a member of one or more Rotary Clubs for at least seven years.
2. Have full qualifications for membership in the strict application of the club membership provisions, and have a classification whose integrity is without question.
3. Have served as president of a club for a full term or be a charter president of a club, having the full term from the date of the charter to June 30, provided that this period is for at least six months.
4. Demonstrate willingness, commitment, and ability, physically and otherwise, to fulfill the duties and responsibilities of the office of governor as provided in RI Bylaws section 15.090.
5. Demonstrate knowledge of the qualifications, duties and responsibilities of governor as prescribed in the RI Bylaws, and submit to RI, through its general Secretary, a signed statement acknowledging a clear understanding of them. This statement shall also confirm that the Rotarian is qualified for the office of governor and willing and able to assume the duties and responsibilities of the office and to perform them faithfully.

Clubs who wish to submit the name of a candidate for consideration should, first, vote at a regular meeting to submit the name of the candidate, then complete and forward the District Governor-Nominee Application Form to DG Darren 'Kip' Kipnis before 10/31/20
