# Douglas Reintgen, MD Professor College of Medicine Surgery

## Topic

Fun in the Sun

Douglas Reintgen, MD specializes in melanoma and breast cancer research and treatment and is internationally known surgical oncologist, researcher, lecturer and Professor of Surgery at the University of South Florida. In 1979 he graduated from the Duke University Medical School followed by a residency in general surgery at Duke. In 1987 Dr. Reintgen accepted a position as Assistant Professor at the University of South Florida in Tampa and the Program Leader of the Cutaneous Oncology Program at Moffitt Cancer Center. He was also named the Assistant Program Leader for Breast Cancer at Moffitt and very quickly these two programs grew in prominence regionally and nationally. Moffitt Cancer Center eventually became an NCI-designated Cancer Center, the only one in the State of Florida during this tenure. Eight years ago he went to Lakeland to build a new Cancer Center and in a short time had recruited 14 full time adult oncology faculty and over 100 employees. Lakeland Regional Cancer Center (LRCC) currently runs 45 clinical trials and enrolls 10% of our patients on clinical trials with 5 full-time research nurses. While at LRCC he established a translational research laboratory with independent funding from the Susan Komen Foundation. Dr. Reintgen has been the visiting professor at 21 Universities throughout the world. Recently he has returned to the University of South Florida as Director of Cancer Initiatives and Professor of Surgery.

#### Stano Foundation Request

thas been brought to our clubes attention that our fellow Rotarian, Paula Stano, of the Stano Foundation needs our help in continuing her foundations efforts to support our troops overseas. The foundation sends care packages to troops deployed and due to the circumstances of Covid not only are her supplies greatly reduced but her ability to raise donations has also been negatively affected. This was brought to our attention when Jason Contino reached out to her to find out how to get some of the packages delivered to a friend he has deployed currently in Afghanistan.

Therefore, we are asking if members can bring in both supplies and monetary donations (to cover the costs of the shipping). Each box cost approximately \$20 to ship and we are going to ship 20 boxes.

One of the particular items that was requested were black or brown boot socks. Paula has enough of the Bombas socks to add to the packages. But we will still need:

- Flavor packets to add to water bottles (powder)
- Snacks (like beef jerky etc)

We will collect the supplies over the next 2-3 weeks, but will need volunteers to pack the care packages in 3 weeks.


