Downtown Tampa is a pretty exciting place to visit, work, and live these days! Karen Kress, Director of Transportation and Planning at the Tampa Downtown Partnership, will join us on Tuesday to share updates and what is on the horizon.





Karen serves as the Director of Transportation and Planning at the Tampa Downtown Partnership. In her role, Karen manages all aspects of transportation, parking and access throughout Downtown Tampa. A true advocate for transit and transportation, Karen leads Tampa Downtown Partnership Transportation and Urban Design Committees, and its Parking Task Force. Karen has been successful in advocating for and bringing transportation options such as Coast bike share, ZipCar carshare, and Downtowner • an app-based electric ride service. An avid biker, Karen helped found Tampa BayCycle (now called Bike Walk Tampa Bay), a regional cycling education, advocacy and encouragement campaign in 2007 and for over twenty years she has actively volunteered for the Sierra Club s Inspiring Connections Outdoors program. Acknowledging her efforts, Karen was honored by the Suncoast Chapter of the American Planning Association Planner of the Year in 2014 and in 2017 she was appointed as a Planning Commissioner by the City of Tampa. She is also a certified League Cycling Instructor (LCI) and is able to teach bike safety classes. Previously, Karen worked in transportation demand management, marketing, human resources and event planning. A native of Ohio and Political Science graduate of Ohio University, Karen moved to Tampa in the mid-1990 s and is raising her three children with her husband in their own little slice of paradise on the Hillsborough River.

## Read with preschoolers via Goodwill Bookworks



The Community Service Committee invites all Rotarians to read to preschoolers through Goodwill SookWorks program. Since schools are not allowing in-person volunteers during the pandemic, our members will do interactive, virtual readings for preschool classes via Zoom. A great chance for community service that is virtual, convenient, and rewarding!

Members interested in reading just need a computer with a camera. Goodwill staff will set up zoom readings with preschools that have that capability. Teachers project the image of the reader on a

whiteboard in the classroom and we read to the preschoolers gathered around the projected image, as pictured here.

After the story time, the teacher will give a book to each child in the class. Goodwill provides the books for the children and for the person reading, unless they have a favorite book they do prefer to read. Rotarians can pick up the books at Goodwill and deliver them to the school ahead of time, or Goodwill staff can deliver the books to the school.


