

DG Mark's Message For October

My Family of Rotary— It has been a busy month for your District Governor! I have enjoyed traveling both in person

and virtually around the district visiting clubs and meeting so many dedicated Rotarians. It is invigorating and exciting for me!

Prior to each club visit I meet with the club leadership team to discuss your club's strategy and membership plans. The sharing of ideas makes this very special. I also get to learn about your community and global projects and your other activities. All wonderful! Congratulations—you are all handling the pandemic restrictions so well. You see the purpose of Rotary and the needs we can fill. Share membership...bring a friend to your next meeting.

The Rotary theme for the month of October is Economic and Community Development. Be sure to read the Minutarian for the first week of October to learn more about what an impact we can make as Rotarians in the lives of others via Economic and Community Development. For now, I want to share a personal experience I had that taught me a lot about this theme.

When I was on the Group Study Exchange trip to South Africa that many of you have heard me speak about already, we were traveling around and seeing women by the side of the road selling oranges and other fruits and vegetables. Our Rotarian host explained that this was part of a "micro loan" program his club was involved in. For example, The Rotary Club would lend enough money for a woman to buy a case of oranges. She would then sell the oranges making enough profit to allow her to buy even more oranges, and so on. A group of 4 or 5 women would meet with a Rotarian who would encourage them and be sure they understood their obligation to repay their loan.

The Rotary Foundation can help set up these "micro loan" programs. If your club is interested, you can do it in your own community. Let me know and I can help you get it going. What a great service project, right?

Be sure to register via DaCdb for our October 24th visit from Ravi Ravindran to help us celebrate World Polio Day. This is a big deal! It is not often that a district gets a visit from the Chair of the Rotary Foundation. Please do not miss this!

Florida Rotary License Plate!

This project has been in development for vears and failed to proceed in the past. Finally with the additional efforts of the Florida Governor Class of 2022-23, the process was finalized and

soon efforts for pre-sales of these unique license plates will begin. We will provide additional information soon as to how to obtain our own *Florida Rotary License Plate*, since the law requires that we pre-sell 1000 license plates within 24 months or sooner to enable the state to produce the plates. And we are fortunate to have a Rotarian from District 6990, who owns an Auto Tag Agency, assisting us!

Rotarian Named in Time

Dr. Tunji Funsho, Rotary's Nigeria National PolioPlus Chair, was named to TIME's "100 Most Influential People in the World" for his critical leadership in working with Rotary members and our partners to achieve a wild polio-free Nigeria and eradicate the world poliovirus in the African region.

He is the first Rotary member to receive this honor for our work to eradicate polio.

Dr. Funsho is a member of the Rotary Club of Lekki in Lagos, Nigeria and is Past District Governor of District 9110 and member of the International PolioPlus Committee. Dr. Funsho is a cardiologist with a lifelong commitment to building a healthier world. Working alongside his fellow Rotarians, Dr. Funsho has built awareness for the importance of polio immunization, encouraged governments and public figures to support polio eradication, and served as a vocal leader and advocate for Rotary and our fight to end polio.

The <u>The TIMES 100 list</u> recognizes the activism, innovation and achievement of the world's most influential individuals. Dr. Funsho joins the list with some of the most important and well-known public figures in the world who have been past recipients of the honor: heads of state such as Angela Merkel, religious figures like the Dalai Lama and Pope Francis, celebrities like Oprah Winfrey and Bono, philanthropists like Bill Gates, and activists such as Malala Yousafzai.

Dr. Funsho stands on the shoulders of the countless women and men of Rotary who have dedicated their lives, their time, and their money to Rotary's top priority of eradicating polio. This honor is not just a testament to his work, it is acknowledgement that Rotary members make a difference in the world—one that is worthy of international recognition among the world's most distinguished leaders.

Every Rotarian can be a leader in the fight to eradicate polio. We hope you'll

use this recognition of Dr. Funsho and Rotary as an opportunity to put renewed energy and focus into creating a world where no child ever again has to be paralyzed by the poliovirus. We've come so far into our fight to eradicate polio, and we've made incredible progress in the face of enormous challenges. As we join in congratulation to Dr. Funsho, let's join together and deliver upon our promise to *End Polio Now*.
